What happens if I have to be absent?

- **Teams** is a tool we'll use for virtual class meetings. You'll join by clicking a link in Schoology. If you are gone for a period of time, we will also use this link to check in and keep up with class work.

- Conjuguemos.com is a website we'll use to practice vocabulary and grammar. You'll make your own log in information. We'll sign up together in class and <u>the</u> <u>password for this website is always *divertido*</u>. If you do a different password, it gets changed back to *divertido* at least once a quarter. - **Online Dictionaries:** We will use <u>Word Reference</u>, the website or the app, for our Spanish-English English-Spanish dictionary. There are others that might work, but beware of those that offer a translation program. SpanishDict.com is particularly troublesome because it might switch you from the dictionary to the translator program without you asking it to.

What is an online dictionary and why shouldn't I use Google Translate or any other translation program for my schoolwork?

Translators like Google Translate conjugate verbs, place pronouns, and choose word order for you, often incorrectly. These are skills you must show you can do on your own through written assignments. Using a program that does this work for you will be considered academic misconduct.

Using these programs and apps is NOT presenting your own work. You will receive a zero for the assignment if you use a translation program.

Instead, the approved dictionary for this course is wordreference.com.

Why shouldn't I use an AI tool like ChatGPT for my coursework?

AI tools like ChatGPT have the potential to do your work for you just like Google Translate. Doing so would be cheating. AI tools also have the potential to be very useful tools to help us learn and practice. Hopefully, we'll get to explore them together in class this year. <u>Unless</u> you've been given specific directions about how and when to use them, do not use AI tools for your coursework.

What am I going to learn?

Spanish I is taught for novice Spanish learners. To be proficient in Spanish I, learners will be working at the Novice Mid level for Communication of the North Dakota Indigenous and World Language Standards and Novice for the modalities of the standards. Students who are advanced will meet some of the standards for at the Novice High.

- 10. Listen to, read, write and speak about classes, classrooms, and where things are located

11. Develop an understanding regarding various cultural perspectives in the Spanish-speaking world

How will I be graded?

Grades are based on a total points system. One homework point is worth the same as one point on a quiz or project.

Homework

- Students complete worksheets at home and receive points for them. At times they are completion points, some worksheets may be graded for accuracy and some worksheets are graded on their reflection. Worksheets may also be a combination of the three items.
 - Students do these worksheets for practice and to move along the learning process. It helps move the vocabulary from recognition of what we are learning to the production of our goals.
- Students will also be graded on some Schoology activities-these may be assigned in class or as homework. If it is a practice activity, the proficiency standard is 80% correct of the practice. To receive 100%, students must reach the proficiency standard. They are allowed to do it multiple times to reach that standard.
- Students spend time studying vocabulary and grammar with **Quizlet** and on **conjuguemos.com**. There usually are no points for this, but students may have to show they've spent time or mastered content before taking a quiz or test.

Quizzes

- Students show their mastery of specific skills (vocab and grammar) before completing the unit test or project.
- Each chapter includes at least 2 quizzes. Dates are outlined on the lesson plan at the start of each chapter.

Test/Project

• Students will use a mixture of communication modalities (speaking, listening, writing, reading) to show their mastery of the unit's objectives.

What are Sra. Walker's expectations about my behavior and participation?

Tardiness

Once we have settled into the pattern of school, I will be utilizing the WFHS tardiness policy. Tardies as UT in PowerSchool. As per the WFPS policy, each fifth unexcused tardy will count as an unexcused absence.

High schoolers are ready to manage their passing time and bathroom use without much support. If you need to use the rest room and come immediately to class (there are multiple minutes left in the passing period), it is ok for the occasional tardy

If using the bathroom causes a **<u>pattern</u>** of tardiness, we'll make a plan to help you avoid being late.

If you are unable to implement your plan, I'll let your guardians and principal know, and I'll start marking late arrivals in Power School. We will start to require detention for each tardy or come up with another appropriate plan to help you improve. As per the WFPS policy, each fifth tardy will count as an unexcused absence.

Late Work

Due dates can be found on the weekly lesson plan. Students should keep note of due dates in their agenda or MyHomework app.

Work turned in past the due date <u>will</u> lose at least one letter grade or proficiency grade. However, you will never fail an assignment just because it is turned in late as long as it is before the unit assessment. It depends on the quality of work. <u>Work turned in after the unit assessment will not receive credit.</u>

Turn in all LATE (and absent) work to the assignment link in <u>Schoology.</u> Remember, the scores may not get updated until Friday morning AFTER you have turned it in. Late work may take up to 5 days to get graded.
