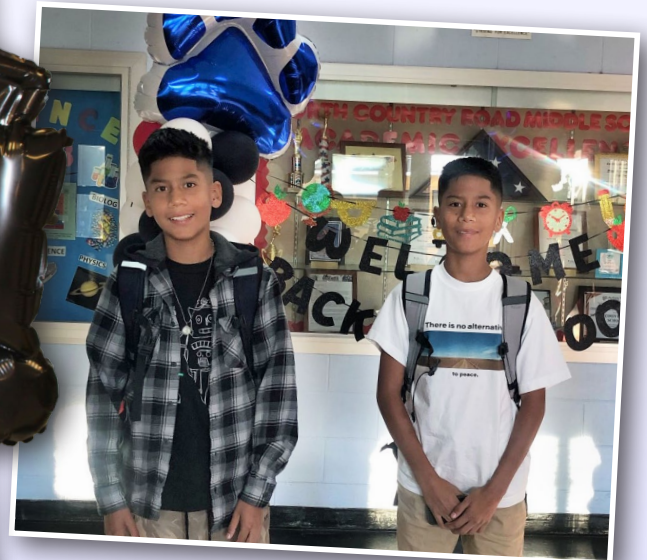

A Message from Superintendent Seth Lipshie

Welcome to the 2024-25 school year. This summer we hired over 30 new staff members that includes clericals, nurses, aides, operations, teacher assistants, teachers and administrators. Going into this year, we are undergoing significant change in each of our building's administrative teams. Change is always part of education and brings new opportunities. I ask our staff and community to embrace new these new opportunities.

In August parents, guardians and students were invited into our buildings for a walk-through and orientation. Staff gathered on August 28th and 29th for Superintendent's Conference Day to finalize preparation for our students' return.

On Tuesday, September 3rd, we welcomed over 2,000 students to classrooms including the 2025 Senior Class along with our newest generation of students as the Class of 2038 entered Andrew Muller Primary School.

As we opened, the new school year activities were in high gear. Each school building had their Open Houses as parents and guardians were invited to meet their child's teachers. 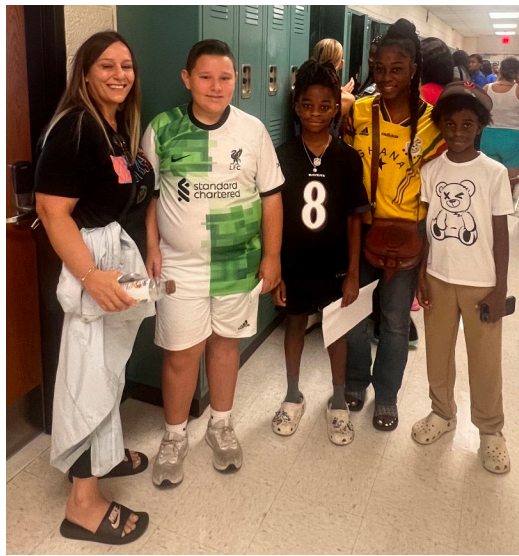


LADDIE A. DECKER SOUND BEACH SCHOOL

NORTH COUNTRY ROAD MIDDLE SCHOOL



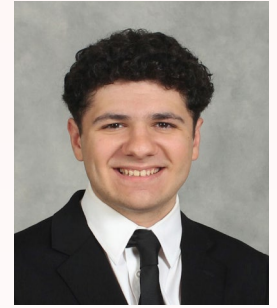
