- 7. Regardless of my age I agree to follow all of the MSHSL Bylaws in order to be eligible to represent my school in League-sponsored activities.

EHS FINE ARTS/ACTIVITIES ELIGIBILITY:

During the calendar year, regardless of the quantity, a student shall not:

- use or possess or distribute a beverage containing alcohol;
- use or possess tobacco or vape devices;
- use or consume, have in possession, buy, sell or give away any other controlled substance;
- use or possess drug paraphernalia.

Penalties:

First Violation: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility of one (1) event or performance in which the student is a participant.

Second Violation: After confirmation of the second violation, the student shall lose eliaibility for two (2) events or performances in which the student is a participant.

No exception is permitted for a student who becomes a participant in a treatment program.

Racial/Religious/Sexual Harassment/Violence/Hazing/Bullying:

A student shall not violate Racial/Religious/Sexual

Harassment/Violence/Hazing/Bullying policy as defined by District 196 and the student handbook.

Directors/Coaches and school administration will work through each violation individually using the stated expectations to determine appropriate consequences.
