★ Enrollments (377, down from 426 end of the year)

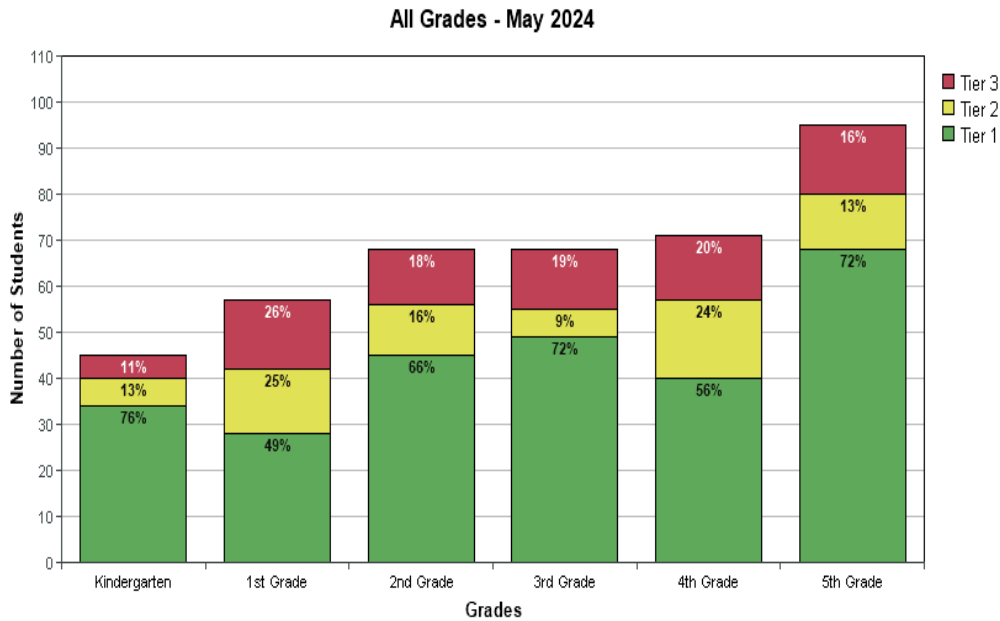
<u>Grade</u>	<u>Enrolled</u>	<u>Attendance</u>
<u>Kindergarten</u>	<u>38 down from 49</u>	<u>We are starting out with 11 fewer than we ended with last year in Kinder but we tend to get an influx right before school starts.</u>
<u>1st Grade</u>	<u>49 down from 63</u>	<u>We have moved all the Kinder to 1st grade.</u>
<u>2nd Grade</u>	<u>65 down from 74</u>	<u>We have gained 2 from 1st to 2nd.</u>
<u>3rd Grade</u>	<u>72 down from 75</u>	<u>We have 2 fewer from 2nd to 3rd.</u>
<u>4th Grade</u>	<u>68 down from 85</u>	<u>We have 7 fewer from 3rd to 4th.</u>
<u>5th Grade</u>	<u>85 down from 108</u>	<u>4th moved to fifth but we moved one class of 5th grade to Butte View</u>
<u>Total Enrolled</u>	<u>377 down from 454 which was our total enrollment throughout last year.</u>	<u>K-5th average attendance for 2023-24 was 94.87% for the year.</u>

- ISAT Scores - Carberry has a lot to celebrate this year with our scores compared to the state and district averages.

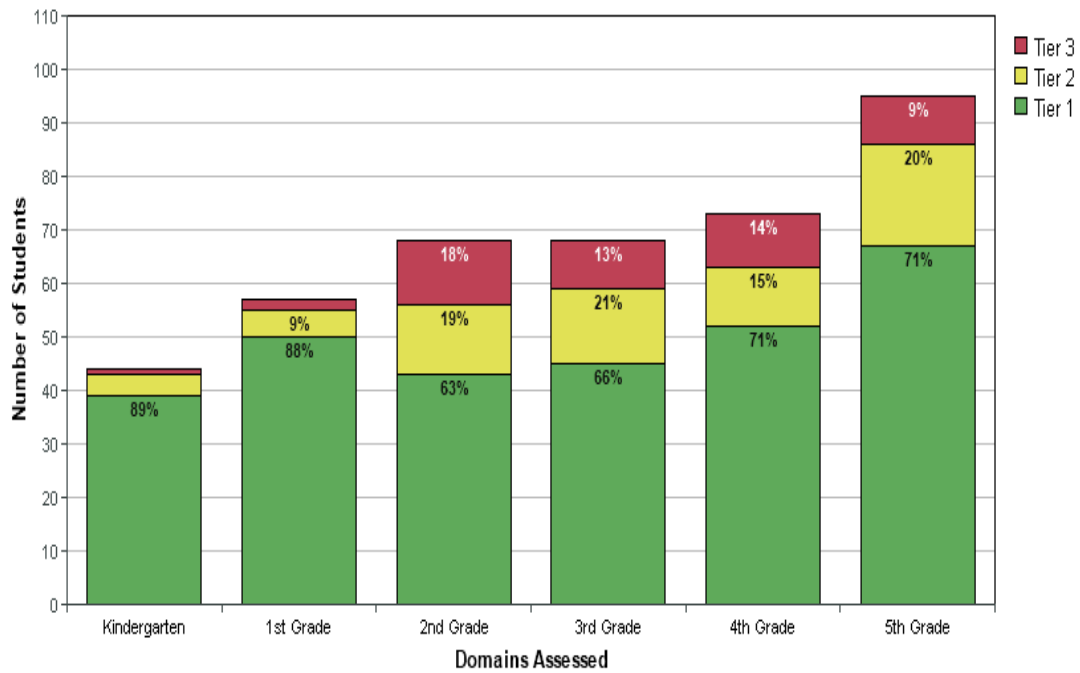
