




Data Celebrations This month, we're excited to highlight the incredible growth of our 1st grade students and teachers! According to our Tier movement report, reading proficiency has significantly improved. At the start of the year, 42% of students were proficient, and now 51% have reached grade-level proficiency, placing them in the green band/Tier 1. Additionally, our red band/Tier 3 students have decreased from 36% in August to 28% in October. We're so proud of the hard work and progress made by our students and teachers!

Each day, we award points or tally marks for positive actions and behavior in the bus lines. At random times, the game is called, and the bus line with the most points wins. A student from the winning line gets to spin the prize wheel for the entire group. This fun initiative has significantly reduced negative behavior in the lines, ensuring students board their buses safely and efficiently!



reacemaker


What this word means to me
