


Special Education Monthly Board Report Emmett School District October, 2024

Special Education Demographics:

• Eight weeks into the school year, as of Oct. 8, 2024, the home page of our IEP platform (Edplan) shows 359 (up from 344) students receiving Special Education with an additional 7 Referrals, and 14 Consents for Evaluation.

Department Projects:

- On September 13th, we held a successful SpEd Professional Development session with our Special Education Teachers, focusing on developing meaningful IEPs. We explored strategies for interactive, efficient IEP meetings, including student-led IEPs and meaningful parent involvement.
- Our School Psychologists attended the Idaho Association of School Psychologists conference on October 3rd and 4th, gaining valuable insights to support our students further.
