was founded in 1877 by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) as Detroit College, U of D Jesuit High School is the oldest continuously functioning secondary school in the city of Detroit. For 147 years, the school has prepared young men from a wide variety of social, economic, ethnic, and religious backgrounds to assume positions of leadership in business, professional, academic and political fields nationwide. In 1976, after a process of consultation and discernment, U of D Jesuit decided to remain within the city of Detroit at the current location on South Cambridge. With this decision, the school made a conscious choice committing itself to diversity - racial, religious and socioeconomic - and serving the entire metropolitan Detroit region.







Honors/AP course availability depends on enrollment and student interest. Admission is based on prerequisite performance (>90%) and teacher recommendations, with scheduling limitations possibly restricting enrollment. Dual Enrollment offers additional rigor for juniors (3.5 GPA) and seniors (3.25 GPA) and is available through University of Detroit Mercy, Lawrence Tech, and Oakland Community College.

HONORS / AP ENROLLMENT GUIDELINES

Freshman year: 2 Honors or AP Classes *

Sophomore year: 3 AP or Honors Classes

Junior year: May take 3 or more AP or Honors Classes

Senior year: May take 3 or more AP or Honors Classes

*Students may appeal enrollment into Honors/AP any year, with the possibility of additional criteria to be met before placement.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS 2023-2024

161 U of D Jesuit students took **270** Advanced Placement exams in 17 subject areas. **75%** of students scored a **3 or higher** on at least one test.

FRESHMAN ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Freshmen are eligible for 2 honors classes, but not AP classes. *Honors Algebra II/Trig and Honors Geometry were introduced for freshmen in 2020-2021, and Honors Biology in 2022-2023, based on entrance exam scores and teacher recommendations.

HONORS / AP SEQUENCING

Students must follow a specific sequence for Honors/AP tracks in some subjects. Depending on individual strengths, it's possible to take the most demanding schedule without AP courses until senior year. For example, Student A, strong in English, Math, and Science, took no Honors/AP courses as a freshman. By sophomore year, they took Honors English II and Honors Geometry. Junior year included Honors English III, Honors Pre-Calculus, and Honors Physics. Senior year, they took AP English, AP Calculus, AP Physics, and Honors Bio-Chemistry, reaching the maximum number of Honors/AP courses, but only starting AP in senior year.

STEM RESEARCH & INQUIRY COURSE

The STEM course attempts to provide high achieving students with the resources and facilities to complete college-level research in their desired field through pairings with professors at local Universities. This course meets before the regularly scheduled day and requires an extensive time commitment, including evenings, weekends, and summer months.



THEOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Theology courses are academically demanding, incorporating the study of anthropology, philosophy, psychology, sociology, history science, and ethics. College textbooks, along with classical and contemporary literature, are used to study theology with a strong emphasis on philosophy. Critical thinking skills, extensive writing, and discussion are integral components of this coursework.



SCHOOL SCHEDULE

For the 2024-2025 U of D Jesuit will have a new dismissal time of 3:00 p.m. School will continue to start at 8 a.m. This change will give us more than 1000 in-person instructional hours for the school year.

Athletics and Cocurriculars

Clubs and activities are an integral part of the school mission to educate the whole person. These co-curricular activities provide students with a blend of social, artistic, academic and service experiences outside the school day. U of D Jesuit students-athletes compete in the Catholic League and the Michigan Interscholastic Hockey League. Athletic teams are regularly awarded Academic All-State honors.

Community Service

Service is at the core of our mission to form "Men for Others." All students over the course of their 4 years are required to engage in a minimum of 145 hours of community service, contributing to those in need and fostering a lifelong commitment to giving back. Service hour requirements start at 15 hours in 9th grade and increase to 25 hours by 11th grade. Seniors dedicate approximately 85 hours through the Senior Service course. Under the guidance of a faculty member, they spend 14 Wednesdays in a full day of service to the Detroit community and engage in reflection activities throughout each semester.



CLASS OF 2025

Consists of **174 young men** who were selectively admitted from the greater metropolitan Detroit area.
