What is a planning/scholarship bulletin?

- This monthly bulletin is provided to help you as you begin and continue in the college application process and search for scholarships. This bulletin is **not** reflective of all information available.
- Some of the best places to look for scholarships are the website of colleges you are interested in, parent/student employee benefits (ask employers), free scholarship search engines (these are linked in the bulletin below).
- Be very suspicious of scholarships or offers that seem "too good to be true," or that promise guaranteed money if you come to a meeting or pay a fee. When in doubt about anything, feel free to contact your school counselor or college adviser!

College Planning Information:

- Common Application: Many colleges use this platform now to receive and keep up with applications. Make sure you go directly to where it asks you to put in your school counselor and recommender information early on to give these individuals ample time to complete their part. Ask permission of recommenders first and make sure to provide a resume of activities & accomplishments either by email or in person for them to use. Recommenders need a least a couple of weeks to complete their portion of the application, so you want to make sure you are asking sooner rather than later!
- **DEADLINES!** Make sure you are paying attention to the deadlines of the schools and scholarships you are applying to. These deadlines can be found on the schools website or through Common App.
- Applying in the fall or "early action" gives you, the student, plenty of time to make a decision about where you want to go to college. Applying early decision vs. regular decision means most likely receiving a decision in January for early decision or March for regular decision. A couple of months makes a huge difference when it comes to being able to make a clear decision!
- Reminder, if your GPA is below a 2.8 you HAVE to submit with your ACT or SAT scores.

This form is required for financial aid for all colleges & universities. Often colleges begin scholarships whether merit or need-based scholarships and grants with the family filing the FAFSA.
