Key Understandings

- This data is current but it will change as enrollment and staffing continues to settle throughout the summer and fall. The data has changed since the Equity Committee meeting at the beginning of July.
- Staffing and enrollment will continue to fluctuate as it always does at this time of the year.
- Staffing reductions and shifts are in alignment with policy and regulations. Any additional staffing movement will remain consistent with our current process to allow for the recall of staff who have been laid off.



Key Understandings

- Class sizes will continue to remain within AAEA contractual limits.
- Continue to provide interventions, supports, and special education services.
- Students will continue to experience elementary special area art, music, physical education, library and PLTW and a wide array of elective courses at the secondary level.
- World Language has been eliminated at non-IB elementary schools; students will continue to receive World Language instruction at the middle and high school levels.



Interventions and Supports



Interventions and Supports

- At the elementary level, students who qualify for reading and math intervention will continue to receive supplemental supports.
- Supports may include:
 - Title I teacher and tutor (in Title I buildings)
 - Intervention from a Building Literacy Coach and Building Math Coach and Reading Assistant
- Students who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) will continue to receive services as required in their plan.
- At the secondary level, students will continue to receive course specific intervention and supports. These courses have not been eliminated.




