Dual Enrollment (DE) at Foothill College

Taking classes independently

"Concurrent Enrollment"

Dual Enrollment

Provides an opportunity for high school students to enroll in college classes while they are still in high school Middle College

College Now!

College & Career Access Pathways (CCAP)



Independent High School Students

- 9-12 grade students taking classes for enrichment or credit recovery
 - Traditionally come to Foothill campus to take classes
- Can enroll in **11 units** in the Fall, Winter, Spring (**6 units** in the Summer) and have tuition fees waived

• Can have access to Foothill's services like other college students



Middle College

Middle College at De Anza for Fremont HS Students

An educational alternative **for FUHSD juniors and seniors** who need a different high school environment in order to achieve success. Students **earn high school and college credit simultaneously**, complete requirements for high school graduation and explore individual interests through a diverse college curriculum.

Middle College program benefits include:

- a wide array of course choices at De Anza College;
- daily schedule flexibility;
- one-on-one support from the Middle College advisors/teachers, as well as from an on-site Middle College guidance counselor;
- access to services and opportunities at De Anza College, from tutoring to clubs and student government;
- ability to earn college credits without taking AP exams;
- participation in high school clubs, activities, and sports that occur after regular high school hours (does not include leadership).



College & Career Access Pathways (CCAP) & AB288

CCAP Classes

Agreement between Foothill and high school to provide **closed** classes for high school students

Classes are traditionally held at the high school

Career Technical Education (CTE) or transfer preparation

Purpose is to serve underrepresented students or students who are not college bound

Students can enroll in up to 15 units each term and have tuition fees waived

Advanced Placement (AP) & DE

Advanced Placement

Dual Enrollment

AP test required to receive college credit 3 or higher to be granted credit

Cost associated with taking AP Exam

College credit

High school GPA boost

Increase readiness for college

College credit will be granted with a minimum of a C as final grade


No cost associated with taking DE class



Benefits of Participating in DE

What are the perks?

- Earn college credit & fulfill high school graduation requirements (CCAP)
- Classes are taught by high school teachers (CCAP)
- High school GPA boost
- UC/CSU transferable
- Increase readiness for college
- Save <u>\$\$\$</u> on college tuition
- <u>Access to Foothill resources</u>





Foothill Resources

As a dual enrollment student you have access to <u>resources and services</u> at Foothill College, just like any other Foothill student

- Services are available both online and in-person
- Examples: Counseling, Academic Tutoring, Transfer Planning, Food Pantry & Other Basic Wellness Needs, Access to Foothill Library & Databases
- Disability & Resource Center
 - 504 Plan & IEP accommodations are carried over to DE classes
- Permission to take up to 15 units per quarter

 - Other advanced classes, extracurriculars, home/work responsibilities
- Additional projects/assignments if you enroll in English 1A/1B
- Foothill dates and deadlines
- Grade will be on Foothill College transcript
