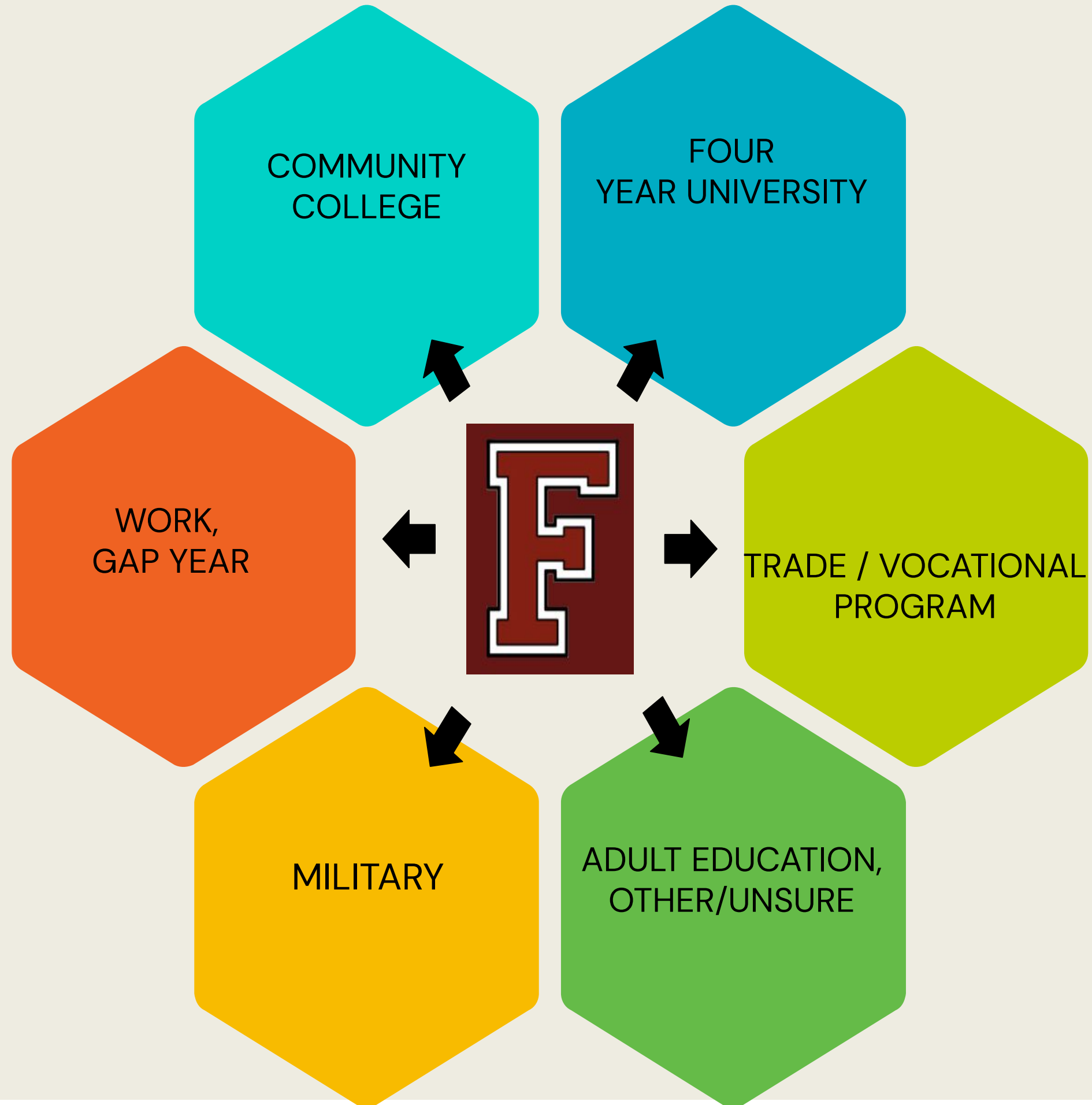
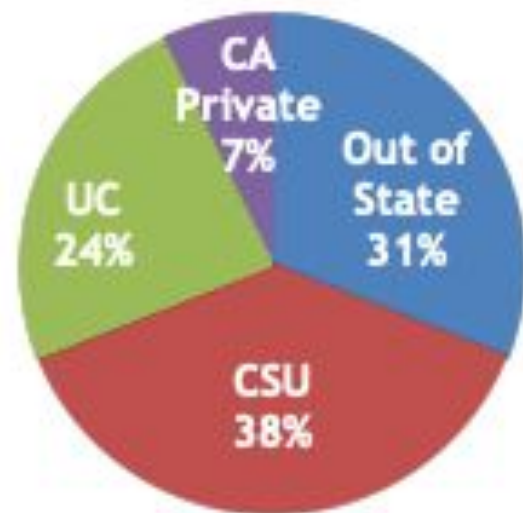
What should 10th graders be doing?

- Students should be getting involved in activities that are meaningful to them / building positive connections
- Doing their best in their classes - sophomore year grades count towards the A-G GPA for UC/CSU's
- Thinking and exploring potential career options and potential classes that align with those career options

- If students do not know what they would like to do yet (very normal), make sure you continue to take A-G classes to keep options open
- Reaching out to teachers and working with them if they need help in their classes - take advantage of tutorials and after school tutoring in Students for Success

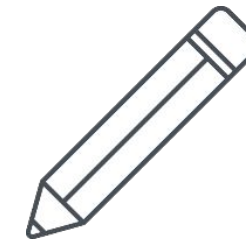

- ❖ Check and see if private or out of state schools require testing - each college is different, check university website for most accurate information
- ❖ Test optional vs. test blind
- ❖ New term: Test expected/ test preferred

Session	Description
College 101	In this session we'll cover the basics of planning for 4 year college. We'll talk about A-G requirements, college testing, majors/careers, timeline of applying, staying competitive, and college essay writing.
