- Applications are now available. Deadline for CSU/UCs is Dec 2nd
- Private Schools- Deadlines vary
- Needs to apply to financial aid- Opens up Dec 1st

Going to a Trade School?

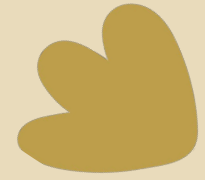
- Research the program and their cost
- See if their program of choice can be done at the community college for less \$\$
- If the student changes their mind make sure their credits can transfer back to a community college

Going to community college?

- Start researching which community college and what program the student is interested in applying for. Not all programs are offered at all community colleges
- Fall Applications are available April 2025
