Attendance Policies

- ✘ Check attendance and grades in PowerStudent daily.
- ✘ Students under age 17
 - Students who reach 3 consecutive days or 5 days total unexcused absences for the school year are considered Truant and placed on an Attendance Intervention Plan in the state of SC
- ✘ Students of any age
 - Students who have more than 5 unexcused absences in one semester will fail due to attendance (FA). This requires attendance makeup to recover the course credit prior to the end of the semester..
- ✘ Early release notes from a parent must be turned in before 1st block to the front office.
- ✘ **No sign outs after 2:00 pm will be permitted without prior notice to the office.**
- ✘ Students must turn in Medical Notes within 24 hours of the absence.
- ✘ Email our attendance clerk, Kim Gordon, or your student's grade-level administrator for assistance.

Nutrition Services

- ✘ All Horry County Schools students will receive one free breakfast and lunch daily this year
- ✘ Students are required to enter their cafeteria number daily in order to receive the free meals
- ✘ Clean up after yourself– respect our campus and hardworking custodians!

Arrival Procedures and School Entry

- Myrtle Beach High School opens at 7:45 a.m. each morning.
- Car riders should use the car loop and enter through the main lobby.
- Car drivers should park in the student parking lot and enter through the main lobby.
- Bus riders will enter through the ROTC hall where buses drop off; students are not to walk around the building.
- Students should arrive no later than 8:00 am to make time for morning search procedures each day. **The search line is not an excuse for tardiness.**
- No outside food is allowed in the building after 8:20 am.
 - Students may not bring in food if arriving late and may not have food delivered to school.

Clear Bag Protocol

- ✗ All backpacks MUST be clear
- ✗ No Color Transparent Backpacks (only fully clear backpacks)
- ✗ Backpacks must have clear visibility through all dimensions excluding the backpack bottom.
- ✗ No Strips on any location of the clear bag
- ✗ No Mesh backpacks of any kind
- ✗ Lunch boxes are permitted, non-transparent lunch boxes may only be as big as 6 x 9 x 5
- ✗ Students may have non-transparent cosmetic bags; however, they may only be as big as 6 x 9 x 5



Dress Code Reminders

- ✗ No hats or hoods (including bandanas and bonnets) may be worn inside the building
- ✗ Pants must be worn at the waist and undergarments must be covered
- ✗ Shorts/skirts must be fingertip length
- ✗ Clothes cannot depict violence, drugs/alcohol or be sexual in nature
- ✗ No midriff tops are permitted
- ✗ Holes in pants must be below the fingertip length
- ✗ No strapless or off-the-shoulder shirts. Straps must be at least 2 inches thick.

Consequences Every Offense: If a student chooses not to follow the dress code requirements, he/she will be asked to call home for a change of clothes. Tardy Policy

- ✘ A tardy is defined as not being seated inside the assigned classroom when the tardy bell rings.
- ✘ Tardies are assigned block by block.
- ✘ Searches will be conducted every morning beginning at 7:45 AM. Searches will not be considered as an excuse for being tardy to class.
- ✘ Students who arrive tardy after 8:20 with an outside food/beverage purchased from a restaurant, cafe, etc. such as Starbucks or McDonalds, will have it confiscated. It may be picked up by the parent.

Smart Pass and Hall Pass Expectations

- ✘ MBHS uses SmartPass to assign passes to students who must leave the classroom for any reason.
- ✘ We follow a first and last 15 minutes of class norm at MBHS
 - Students are not permitted to leave the classroom during the 1st or last 15 minutes of the 90 minute block
 - Students should use the restroom during class changes
 - Critical academic instruction occurs during each block with the first 15 minutes of the lesson setting the goals for the day and clarifying learning objectives. The final 15 minutes bring review and closure.
 - The safest place for any student to be during the day is in the classroom with his/her teacher.

CEIA Open Gate

ALL STUDENTS WILL PROCEED THROUGH THE CEIA OPENGATE SECURITY SCAN UPON entry to the building.

- *Clear backpacks should be worn directly on the back, using both shoulder straps.

- *Metal tumblers, umbrellas, and glasses cases are known items that will alarm the system, so please do not pack these in backpacks.

Students will then have their backpacks searched as a secondary search procedure.

- *Reducing the amount of unnecessary items will expedite the search process.

Students should bring no more than one pencil or personal pouch in their backpacks.

Mandatory Reporting

- ✘ South Carolina Law Section 63-7-310 requires school personnel to report to DSS and law enforcement suspected cases of child abuse or neglect.
- ✘ South Carolina Law Section 59-32-36 prohibits school staff and officials from withholding knowledge of a minor's perception of their gender from the minor's parents.

Reporting Potentially Dangerous Behavior

If we have information concerning someone's safety and don't tell, we are weakening our school. If we know something dangerous, illegal, or just plain wrong is occurring, we will tell our principal or other trusted adult. Outside of school hours, call 911 for all emergencies.

During school hours or for situations that are not emergencies, email our principal or grade level administrator, drop an anonymous note, have our parents call the school; we will do what we need to do to let our school know what is going on.

This will permit the adults who love us at school to keep us all safe and sound. If you know and don't report, you may be held accountable.

Cell Phone Policy

- ✘ MBHS is a phone-free zone. Learning and safety come first. We want your student(s) to be fully present!
- ✘ Students may only use cell phones and earbuds during their designated lunch.
- ✘ Students needing to call home may use a school phone. Parents needing to reach their student should call the school directly.
- ✘ Administration will confiscate phones from students who violate this rule for the duration of the day.
- ✘ Students may pick up their phones at the end of the day on the 1st & 2nd offense. However, on the 3rd offense a parent will be required to pick up the student's phone.

CELL PHONES AND EARBUDS

During the instructional school day, **cell phones**, **earbuds** and **similar electronic devices** will remain silent and out-of-sight. This includes; inside classrooms (unless permitted by the teacher) and in hallways during class and class changes. Students may use these devices during lunch break.

To ensure safety, students are not permitted to walk around campus with:

- Cell phones out and actively talking on the phone
- Cell phone out and texting on the cell phones
- Earbuds in their ears
- Audio and video recording is not permitted and subject to suspension.
