CFISD continues to accommodate growth with new campuses funded by the 2019 bond referendum. Our 59th elementary school, Byrd Elementary, opened in the Miramesa development in August.

CFISD devoted \$336,068,000 in bond funds to 27 summer renovation projects in 2024, including a major renovation to the property behind Cy-Fair High School. Along with new athletic fields and additional parking, a new boulevard on the property will improve traffic flow on the streets surrounding the school.

Ongoing bond renovations have helped secure many elementary campuses originally designed as "open concept" in the 20th century. The campus segmentation project will conclude in 2024-2025, enhancing CFISD's safety efforts.

The CFISD police department enters its 13th year with 117 fully commissioned, well-trained officers and five K-9s that specialize in narcotics and gunpowder and explosives detection. The Ben Bradley Police Headquarters underwent a major expansion in 2023-2024 allowing more space and features for the department.

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The district's mental health intervention team (MHIT), comprised of four licensed professional counselors, two licensed psychologists and two mental health police officers, continues to provide a proactive, targeted, and safe approach to dealing with mental health issues in CFISD. Positive relationships between counselors and students are critical for a healthy learning environment. CFISD's 1:1 device program allows enhanced instruction for more than 118,000 students on a high-speed data network with instant connectivity.

Additional technology components like Lightspeed audio systems, Promethean panels, teacher laptops, and hundreds of software applications allow educators to better reach CFISD students in modern learning environments.

Amazing! TECHNOLOGY

Schoology, the district's Learning Management System, allows teachers to place instructional materials in one place, providing a one-stop shop for students to access digital materials.

CFISD works with partners like Content Keeper, the district's content filter, the 1Edtech Consortium, COSN's Trusted Learning Environment (TLE) Program, and Google Education Plus to ensure student safety in a changing digital world.

Amazing! COMMUNITY

Business and faith-based partners give back to the school district in many ways. These include Adopt-a-School partnerships that pair an organization with a campus to provide resources and support. CFISD reached 93 total Adopt-a-School partnerships in 2024.

CFISD's 537 mentors regularly give their time to at-risk students throughout the district.

CFISD passed a budget providing staff raises for the 13th straight year. In addition to the 2% raise for teachers, the starting teacher salary was elevated to \$63,000, making CFISD a destination district for rookie educators.
