


Choose Love

This week our Choose Love Champions for Courage went out into the community and delivered flowers for National Petal it Forward Day!


Also, our 5th Grade Choose Love Ambassadors participated in a community service activity at the First Methodist Church. Students helped serve lunch to community members for Meals of Love.





4th Grade

Our mathematicians are learning all about fractions. They spent last week learning how to decompose and add and subtract fractions. This week, they learned how to compare fractions and relate fractions to decimals in regards to tenths and hundredths.



5th Grade

For Choose Love, students defined positive relationships and understood that friends might have different thoughts, feelings, and wants than they do. Our readers reviewed what they have learned from the elements of poetry and drama and how to revise their writing. Our mathematicians added and subtracted fractions and simplified numerical expressions with fractions. Our scientists used the engineering design process to build circuits and analyze the transformation of electrical energy. Our historians analyzed the causes and effects of events during the American Revolution. Additionally, they summarized the results of the American Revolution, including the establishment of the United States.

6th Grade

Science is all about the Periodic Table of Elements. Students are learning how the table is organized and the physical properties of the elements. Students will be evaluating different objects to identify if they are a metal, metalloid, or nonmetal. Then, they will look at how elements are important in modern life and where some of them can be found.
