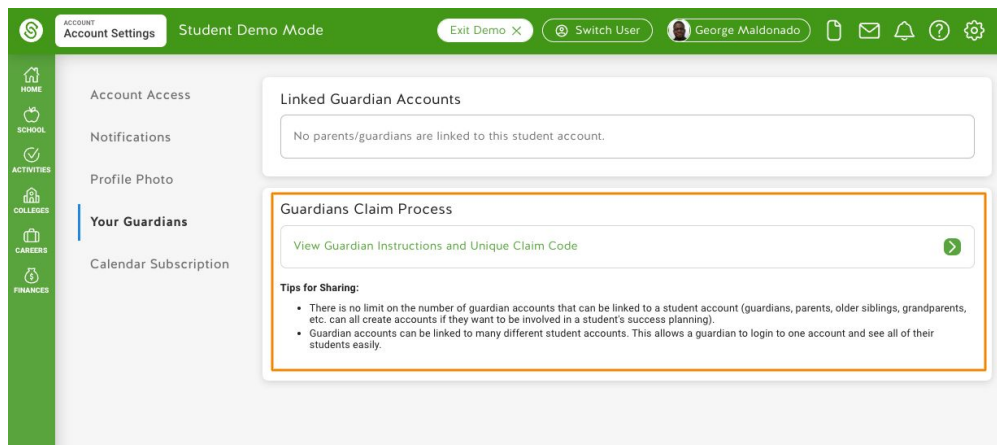

How to Create an Account and Claim Your Student

Getting Your Claim Code

- To complete this process, you will need to get the **unique 6 digit "claim code"** for your student
- You can get the claim code directly from your student or from their counselor
- Students can find the claim code in their account settings by clicking “Your Guardians”



Creating Your Account

- Click on Sign up as a Guardian
- From here, you can use Google or LinkedIn Single Sign-on, or create an account using an Email and Password.
- If using an Email and Password, fill out the necessary information on this screen, then click Continue.



- Next you will create your account



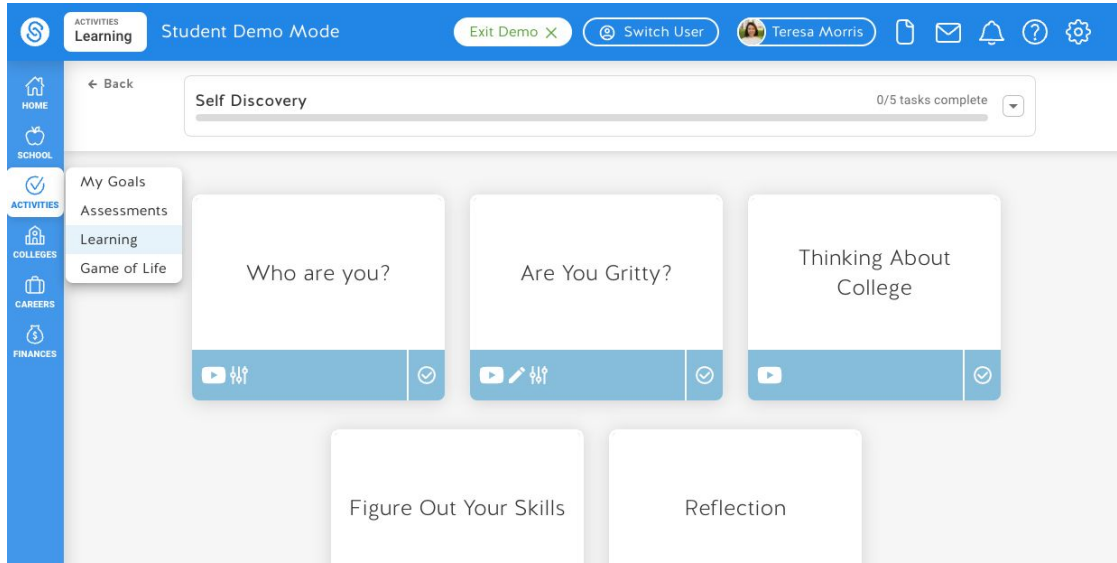

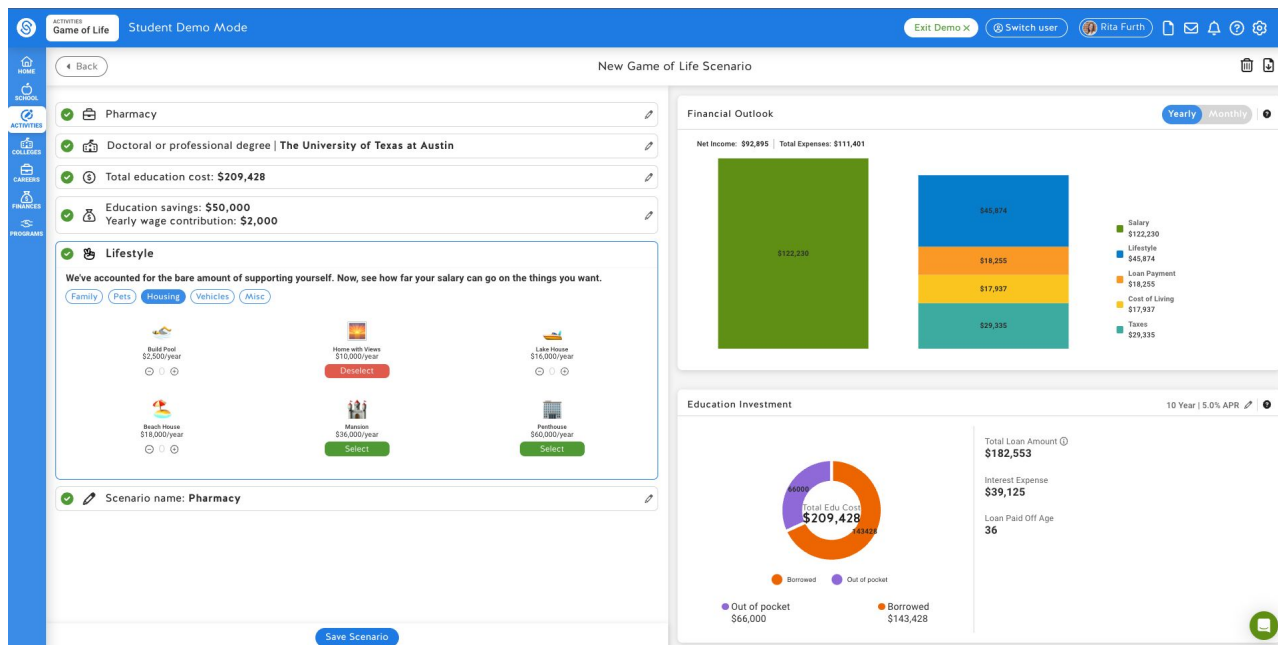
Learn On Their Own Schedule

- District will assign certain tasks and lessons based on grade level to help remind students of important to-dos

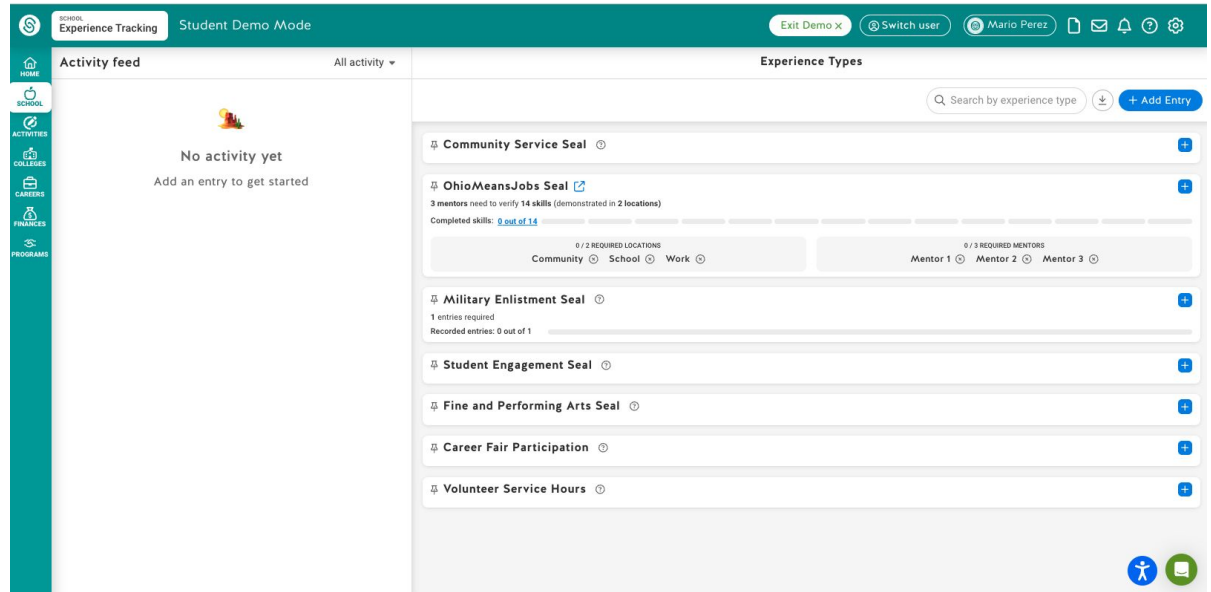
The Game of Life
