When the South High School volleyball team visits North High School on Saturday, the Eastern Dakota Conference foes will be competing on the court, but will work together to increase breast cancer awareness and raise money to donate to Pink it Forward during the Dig Pink match.

There will be "Miracle Minute" donation opportunities, where kids run around with buckets to grab donations from the crowd. For a dollar, members of the crowd will be invited to try their hand at serving a volleyball at targets to try to win prizes. And special Dig Pink T-shirts were ordered and available for purchase leading up to the match.

The teams will honor breast cancer survivors at the game by asking them to stand and be recognized.

Pink it Forward is a North Dakota-based organization with the mission of providing hope and empowerment by enriching the lives of all those affected by breast cancer. The organization provides care packages for individuals who are currently going through cancer treatment and include items such as blankets, robes, and water bottles. The organization is comprised of four family members who have seen 10 women in their family diagnosed with breast cancer within the last three generations.
