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

What is State-Administered Prekindergarten in New York State?

State-Administered Prekindergarten*, also known as Universal PreK (UPK), is a state and federally funded program offered to families free of charge. The only eligibility requirement for State-Administered Prekindergarten in New York State is a child's age and residency. In New York State, there is currently enough federal and state funding available to serve approximately 100% of the state's four?year-old population.



Children who attend prekindergarten are more likely to graduate high school and attend college.



Children who attend prekindergarten earn significantly more as adults, and are less likely to be unemployed.



Studies have shown that for every \$1 invested in prekindergarten, the community sees a \$7 return on investment through decreased public spending on those

Guidance for Supporting Positive Behaviors at Home

How do I provide support for my child socially and emotionally?

- Establish strong and predictable <u>family routines</u> at home. A routine is an event that is completed on a regular basis, frequently involving a series of responses. You may want to develop a routine for daily activities such as getting ready in the morning, eating meals, or going to bed at night.
 - Morning Routine
 - Bedtime Routine
- Create family rules at home with your child

How do I help prevent tantrums from occurring throughout the day?

 Give your child choices and allow him or her to make choices throughout their day when it is appropriate. You can give your child the choice between milk or juice or have them pick out their own clothes for the day.
Choices empower your child and allow for control and ownership over their day. Choices will help to avoid tantrums, build confidence, add value, teach responsibility, promote creativity, and develop problemsolving skills.



Age 3 Standards



Purpose: To provide educators with a set of guidelines developed specifically for three-year-old students.

- Offers suggestions of skills that students may accomplish with adult support while participating in a three-year-old prekindergarten program
- Emphasizes play and developmentally appropriate practices
- Encompasses all 5 domains of learning, similar to the other standards resources documents
- Includes suggested classroom practices for three-yearold students


Implementing the Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Education Framework in the Prekindergarten Classroom



Purpose: Provide guidance to the field regarding 4 principles of CR-S and its application to the PreK context.

- Principles of CR-S include creating a welcoming and affirming environment, setting high expectations and providing rigorous instruction, providing inclusive curriculum and assessment and providing ongoing professional learning.
- Each principle has specific examples on how all educators (teachers, paraprofessionals, administrators) can promote and apply the CR-S to the PreK context.
- A reflection checklist is included to aide educators in reflecting on each domain and how to plan next steps for improving CR-S practices.


EML Guidance

Transition to Kindergarten Toolkit




The transition toolkit is a vital resource for administrators, providing a structured approach to planning, implementing, and evaluating transition activities. It ensures that all stakeholders are prepared, engaged, and working collaboratively to support children's successful entry into kindergarten, ultimately promoting positive educational outcomes.

Purpose: To develop guidance, tools, and resources for LEAs that:

- Equips educators, administrators, Community-Based Organizations (CBOs), and families with detailed information and clear guidance to support a child's transition
- Ensures continuity in transition
- Provides Research-Based activities and strategies
- Provides a common understanding among stakeholders.
