Welcome and Introductions - Karen Shapiro

Superintendent's Report - John Hood

- Stress-management/sleep/device use presentation part of the "Student Wellness Series". Dr. Hannah Hoffman, MSU re: Sleep/wellness. January 23: Sleep/school start time conversation with the rest of the county/MASB
- We have been invited by a State organization (MASB) to present on security.
- Energy Savings Bond will be brought to the Board of Education in the next few months. Saving money on energy costs will help stretch the bond \$ further.

- OHS is switching to 3 lunch periods to alleviate overcrowding, especially with colder weather coming. This existed in the past as well, so not a new thing.
- Community Education structure changes Split childcare with sports/rec/community activities.
- Brian Kremkow new food services director
- Katie Diehl (present) with John Hood and security participate in behavioral threat assessment work behind the scenes.
- Mr. Hood will be out in November (medical). Stacey Bailey will be acting Superintendent.
- Discussions re: Board roles vs. Superintendent roles. Better practices for the future.

• Kinawa Update

- We are intentional on safety and security for district
- Jason Russell, SEC Secure Environmental Consultants, is our security consultant.
 Worked on hardening schools; pro-active for a good environment; Threat assessments.
- Dr. Margaret Coggins (VA/DC) trained the Okemos team to assess threats.
 - The process occurs regularly and successfully Use a behavioral threat assessment process.
 - Use best practices from national organizations.
- Trying to educate the community on our processes.
 - 1. Remove from building/school
 - 2. Check lockers and backpacks
 - 3. Police complete home visit (see if firearms in home/accessible)
 - 4. Keep kid home if necessary (sometimes can't due to IEP protections)
 - 5. Cannot share all details with the community protected by law.
- Use MSU experts to help families.
- OPS does expel kids when necessary.

- Comment: Social media response happened as a response to lack of communication. John/response: If after hours, call Meridian Township Police who will call John.
- Question: Why are there no adults present to get into the school in the mornings before the door locks? John and Katie responded that they will look into this. Adults are present a bit further into the building.
- Will communicate safety processes to the District.
- Applied for after-hours grants
- Leah Kwapis noted that there is a Kinawa-only FB page.
- Katie Diehl answered many security-specific questions.
- Comment: Maybe teachers can address kids' concerns to squash rumors.
- Urge parents to talk to the principal, Katie Diehl, or Mr. Hood before others.
