## V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

We respectfully ask that issues related to specific school district personnel or students be brought to the attention of the Superintendent or Principal privately. EJ Thiel would like to address the board regarding transportation. There are four students participating in indoor track at Springville High School at this point. At the Board of Education regular meeting on December 5, 2016, it was approved that if the number of West Valley student athletes was not 5 or more, transportation will not be provided. The students would like to know if the BOE would change their decision to four. After discussion, the board decided to keep the number at 5 and update BOE policy #7420. They do not want to set a precedent by changing it to less than five. The board thanked them for coming to the meeting. It is not that they do not want see our students participate, but they have to draw the line somewhere.

#### VII. REPORTS

A. Superintendent, Eric Lawton reported that he invited the Ellicottville Board of Education to attend our Board meeting to address any questions regarding the Pre-Annexation Study. He also sent them the list of questions that Dr. Silky is asking to have compiled and a copy of Dr. Silky's proposal. He had a meeting with Kim Moritz, Superintendent of Springville, Dr. Silky and consultants at Springville School today. At the CSO meeting with Joe Giglio and Cathy Young, it was discussed what the impact of the proposed federal budget would be on New York State. If we cannot get them to change the proposed federal income tax, it would be devastating to New York residents. There is a fear that Wall Street could move its location out of NYC and this would create a large hole in the budget. The state is also looking at a 4 billion dollar deficit in the budget this year and as of yet we are not sure what programs will be affected. It was also discussed the duplication of forms that districts have to fill out for state and federal. Eighteen states have the state send the information directly to the federal government so they are not repeating the effort. The Governor has threatened to force out any school district from the health consortium with less than 100 employees. This would be disastrous for us as a small district. We would have to go out into the open market to get our health insurance and our costs would sky rocket. Eric was able to discuss with them that the Pilot we receive has not increased since 1996. He is on a committee with Charlie Davis and John A. Pfeffer to continue pushing the Federal Government to recognize the importance of getting the pilot increased and to provide Impact Aid to the town and school district. Over 90% of the waste is from Federal sources. He met with Charlie Davis regarding the Town possibly helping us with the roads to the field and to the grove. This would be in exchange for the use of our well and their access to it. He said that he would get back to me on the best way to get this done. Veterans Day breakfast was a very nice event. Community Veterans were invited and classes provided the following: placemats, banners, cards, baked goods, songs and a poem. Thank you to everyone that helped make the breakfast very special for the men and women that served our country.

B. Principal, Daniel Amodeo stated that flyers would go home for students in grades 3-6 as an initial sign up for an intramural soccer season. Mrs. Lindberg has taken the lead on coordinating this program Would like to run a soccer season from December 5 to January 25 and then a basketball season from approximately the first week of February to the end of March. An after school weight room program is offered for two days per week, one day for 7-8 graders and one day for 9-12. Supervisors will be AED/CPR certified.

Boys on the Right Track and Girls on the Run programs are complete for the season. The feedback that we have received from families and students has been extremely positive. We have also received many inquiries and requests regarding the continuation of these programs in the spring season. We had 15 student participants for the Girls on the Run and 14 for the Boys on the Right Track and if additional students want to join in the spring, we might have to hire another coach.

Bryan Hansen and Jody Thiel attended the TCIF at CA BOCES on Thursday, November 9. This is a regular meeting for Technology Coordinators. Jody Thiel presented our Maker Space at WVCS to CA BOCES district. Jody facilitated the funding of our Maker Space through a program called Donors Choose. The STEAM and design thinking that Jody is infusing into the Library program was exemplified in the student videos we viewed at our last Board meeting. We are extremely proud of the work of our students and the leadership Jody is providing to take our program to the next level. Chess club has 15 student participants, very exciting. Sarah Sheffield made area All State for Band.

C. Business Official, Ann O'Brien reviewed a revised copy of the Financial Reserve Plan Document. She explained different reserves accounts available, reserve accounts that we have and how much money is in those reserve accounts. There are advantages of having these accounts, to keep the tax rate stabilized and to maintain or improve the district's bond rating, which saves money for the taxpayers.

Finance manager is the software we use to maintain the District's accounting, payroll, and human resource records. The software is purchased through Erie 1 BOCES Finance Manager has upgraded the software to nVision. We will be transferring over to the new system in February.
