It was a moving ceremony celebrated by Bishop Steven Parks. During the profession of vows, the Brothers committed themselves to a life dedicated to God. They promised to live according to the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, obedience, and a fourth vow specific to their order called "Total Availability To The Heart of Christ," meaning they pledge total Identification with the Heart, Person, and Mission of Christ. Bishop Parks prayed for the Brothers to always find great joy and peace in their vocation and in their relationship with the Lord.

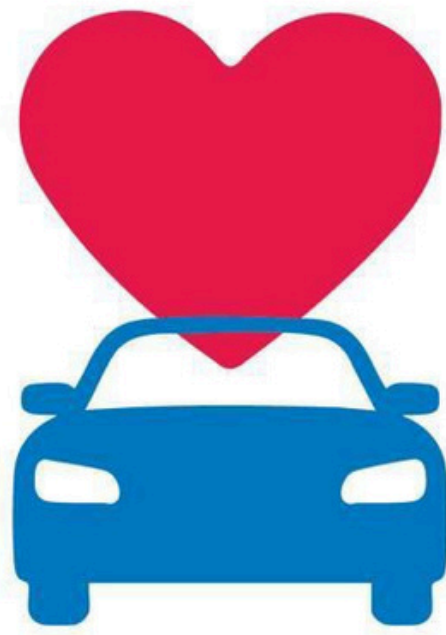

VOTE NO ON AMENDMENT 4

Repeats all common sense laws enacted by our duly elected state representatives.



Ballot Summary

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability, or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

Viability is not defined, and will include painful, late-term abortions through birth.

No definition for healthcare provider is given, leading to non-physicians performing abortions.

Parental notificatin is NOT parental consent, allowing underage children to obtain abortions without their parents' permission.

By precedent, this is not just about physical health, but also emotional, financial, etc. creating no limits on abortion.



No on Amendment 3: Recreational Use of Marijuana

“I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”
John 10:10

Voting No on Amendment 3 will ensure that the recreational use of marijuana remains illegal for all Floridians.

Prevent Increased Use of and Addiction to Marijuana

Legalizing marijuana makes it more accessible, removes the criminal penalties and stigma attributable to it, and creates the impression that it is safe to use. i Taken together, these factors ultimately lead to increased use of the drug—by as much as 20% in adults. ii

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, people who use marijuana have almost a 10% likelihood of becoming addicted, with that risk increasing in people who use marijuana frequently or start using it during youth or adolescence. iii Marijuana use among young adults is already at an all-time high, with 10% using it daily and almost 50% using it within the last year. iv

Avoid Adverse Health Outcomes

Decades ago, the level of the main psychoactive ingredient in marijuana, THC, was typically 2-3%. Products today, however, can have THC levels as high as 90%, creating significantly stronger effects on brain function—specifically memory, learning, attention, decision-making, coordination, emotions, and reaction time. v This negative impact on brain function, in turn, leads to increased motor vehicle accidents, cases resulting in trauma, and use of psychiatric emergency services, emergency rooms, and poison control services. vi

Because the human brain is not fully mature until our mid-to-late 20s, young people are even more susceptible to the adverse effects of marijuana. vii In fact, research has linked the use of marijuana by young adults to psychiatric disorders such as depression, bipolar disorder, and schizophrenia, especially in young men. viii

Similarly, some women turn to marijuana to reduce severe nausea during pregnancy. ix This, however, increases the risk of stillbirth, premature birth, low birth weight, and impaired development of a baby’s brain, including memory, learning skills, and behavior. x

Adhere to the Church’s Teachings

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “The use of drugs inflicts very grave damage on human health and life. Their use, except on strictly therapeutic grounds, is a grave offense” (no. 2291).

Furthermore, at an international drug enforcement conference almost 10 years ago, Pope Francis was clear: Drugs are an evil, and with evil there can be no yielding or compromise...No to every type of drug use. It is as simple as that...But to say this ‘no,’ one has to say ‘yes’ to life....love...others...education...[and] greater job opportunities. If we say ‘yes’ to all these things, there will be no room for illicit drugs, for alcohol abuse, for other forms of addiction. xi

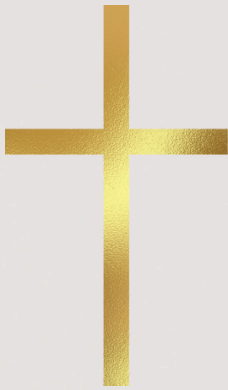

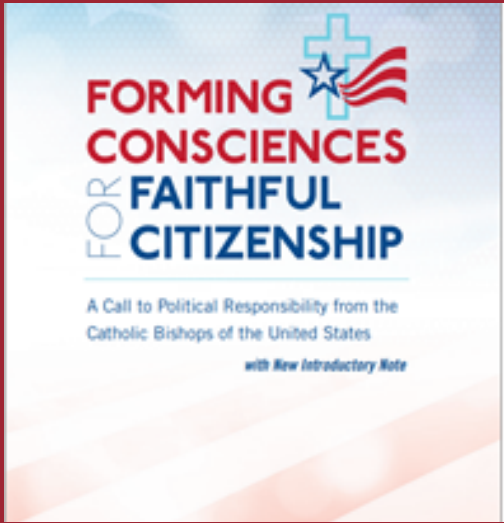

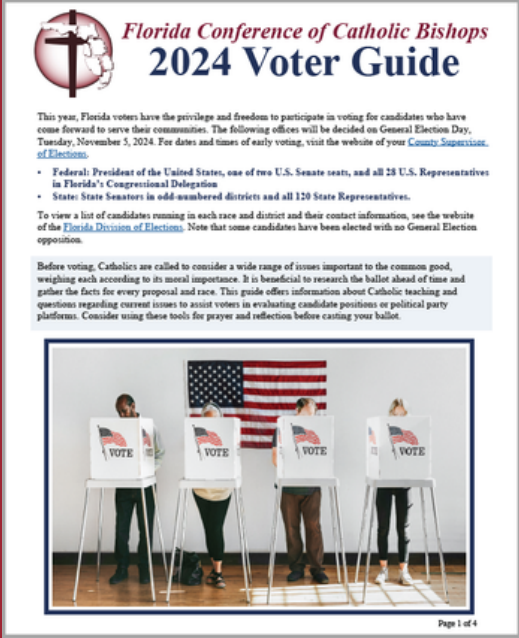
2024 General Election Resources

The 2024 election season is upon us and faithful citizens can use this time to form their consciences, learn about the issues, and research the candidates as they prepare to cast their ballots. The following resources are offered by the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops (FCCB) to assist in this endeavor. The USCCB offers this teaching document to guide Catholics in the exercise of their rights and duties as participants in our democracy. Pastors, lay and religious faithful, and all people of good are urged to use this statement to help form their consciences; to teach those entrusted to their care; to contribute to civil and respectful public dialogue; and to shape political choices in the coming election in light of Catholic teaching.



Before voting, Catholics are called to consider a wide range of issues, weighing each according to its moral significance. Gaining familiarity with the candidates' positions on issues involving human life and dignity is essential to responsible, faithful citizenship. It is beneficial to research the ballot ahead of time and gather the facts for every proposal and race. The FCCB Voter Guide provides information about Catholic teaching, offers considerations on key topics, and poses questions regarding current issues to assist voters in evaluating candidate positions or political party platforms.

PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE COMPARISON	
In keeping with its mission, the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops aims to educate and inform Catholics about a wide range of issues. The information compiled here has been gathered from policy, public statements, official and campaign websites, and other sources. It is intended to help voters make informed decisions before voting in November. The issues that appear here do not represent a complete list of issues that are of importance to Catholics. The FCCB neither supports nor opposes any candidate for public office.	
 Vice President KAMALA HARRIS	 Former President DONALD TRUMP
ABORTION In a 2023 interview, Harris said , "We need to put into law the protections of Roe v. Wade. And that is about going back to where we were before the Dobbs decision." Harris posted on social media in July 2024, "We who believe in reproductive freedom will stop Donald Trump's extreme abortion ban—because we trust women to make decisions about their bodies." In her address at the Democratic National Convention, Harris said , "When Congress passes a bill to restore reproductive freedom, as president of the United States, I will proudly sign it into law."	ABORTION As president, Trump nominated three Supreme Court justices who voted to overturn Roe v. Wade. In an April 2024 video, Trump said , "My view is now that we have abortion where everyone wanted it from a legal standpoint, the states will determine by vote or legislation. Many states will be different." He also said he would not sign a national abortion ban. In August 2024, Trump said he is voting no on Florida's ballot Amendment 10, which would legislate abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy with no protections for the unborn baby.
CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM Harris 2020 also included legalizing marijuana, abolishing mandatory minimum sentences, ending the death penalty and solitary confinement, stopping private prisons, getting rid of cash bail, and leveraging the president's clemency powers to reduce the number of people in federal prison. As a Senator, Harris introduced a bail reform bill with Sen. Rand Paul (R-KY) in 2017 and voted in favor of the First Step Act in 2018.	CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM In 2018, Trump signed into law the First Step Act, which, according to a Federal Bureau of Prisons outlet , "was the culmination of a bi-partisan effort to improve criminal justice outcomes, as well as to reduce the size of the federal prison population while also creating mechanisms to maintain public safety." During an Aug. 2020 White House briefing, Trump stated , "I'll appoint more tough-on-crime prosecutors. . . . When you enforce the law, order follows. And we need order."
DEATH PENALTY During her 2020 Presidential bid, Harris stated she would seek to end the death penalty. In 2024, the Democratic National Committee dropped the call for an end to the death penalty from its platform.	DEATH PENALTY The Trump administration opposed over 13 federal executions. Trump has said that he supports expanding the death penalty to include convicted drug smugglers/traffickers.
EDUCATIONAL CHOICE No statements on Harris' position on educational choice were found. The 2024 Democratic Party Platform states, "We oppose the use of private school vouchers, tuition tax credits, opportunity scholarships, and other schemes that divert taxpayer-funded resources away from public education."	EDUCATIONAL CHOICE Trump's website states , "Republicans believe families should be empowered to choose the best Education for their children. We support Universal School Choice in every State in America. We will expand 529 Education Savings Accounts and support Homeschooling Families equally."
ENVIRONMENT At a UN climate summit in 2023, Vice President Harris announced "a new \$3 billion pledge to the Green Climate Fund, which helps developing countries invest in resilience, clean energy, and nature-based solutions."	ENVIRONMENT In 2019, the Trump Administration began the process of withdrawing from the Paris agreement on climate change, an international accord to reduce global green-house gas emissions.
GENDER ISSUES In social media posts in June/July of 2023 , Harris called on Congress to pass the Equality Act, which would add the new terms "sexual orientation" and "gender identity" to the definition of "sex" in federal civil rights laws, and would exempt itself from the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993. As a U.S. Senator, Harris also opposed the Equality Act in 2017.	GENDER ISSUES In a Jan. 2023 video, Trump said , "I will ask Congress to pass a bill establishing that the only genders recognized by the United States government are male and female and they are assigned at birth. The bill will also make clear that Title IX prohibits men from participating in women's sports and we will protect the rights of parents from being forced to allow their minor child to assume a gender which is new and an identity without the parents' consent."
HEALTH CARE At a March 2024 event, Harris said the Biden-Harris Administration "strengthened the Affordable Care Act so that, today, more Americans have healthcare coverage than ever before."	HEALTH CARE In a Nov. 2023 social media post, Trump said , "Getting much better Healthcare than Obamacare for the American people will be a priority. . . . It's not a matter of cost, it's a matter of HEALTH. America will have one of the best Healthcare Plans anywhere in the world. Right now it has one of the WORST!"

In keeping with its mission, the FCCB aims to educate and inform Catholics about a wide range of issues. The FCCB has developed a comparison between the positions of candidates for United States President, Kamala Harris (Democrat) and Donald Trump (Republican), on multiple topics. The positions of the candidates have been compiled directly from policies, public statements, official or campaign websites, and other sources, as of September 6, 2024. The FCCB is nonpartisan and does not support or oppose candidates.
