Our new communication system should be completely up and running now and after many many many hours on the phone with support, we think all of the bugs have been worked out. Couple of notes:

- If you have not already opted in to receive texts, you will receive a message on Friday, 10/25/2024 at 11:30 AM to do so. If you DO NOT opt-in via this text, that phone number will never be authorized to receive text messages.
- Attendance calls resumed today. If you end up with multiple calls/emails throughout the day when
 your kiddo only missed one class, please let admin know. You should receive a call/text/email for
 each class period your student is marked absent for (excused absent will not get calls).
- If messages continue to be sent to emergency contacts, please let admin know via email who your student is, grade level, and the phone number/email address that should NOT be on the contact list.
 Messages should only be going to the parents/guardians and the student.

Thank you so much for your patience in this transition as it has NOT been as easy one for us!

Safety Note for the Future

Our staff noticed that many students left Homecoming early on Saturday and proceeded to the neighborhood parks next door and the larger Ventana Ranch park. We asked students as they were leaving if they let parents know, and of course they all said 'yes.' Staff is not permitted to keep students on campus when they leave extracurricular activities such as games/dances. With that said, any student who leaves the activity early will NOT be permitted to reenter and must leave the campus immediately. Students will not be allowed back on campus once they have left. Leaving the campus to strongly discouraged! There is no supervision offered and students will be out in public, alone at night, with possible strangers at these very dark venues. We strongly suggest students make plans to go to another safe, inside location following these kinds of events.



Halloween Costume Dress Code

Halloween is Thursday, October 31st. Students may dress up following the guidelines below ONLY for Thursday, October 31st. Any student is costume on any other day will have to call home for a change of clothing.

- No full face masks or full face coverings
- · No look alike weapons, blood, guts or fake body parts
- Wear appropriate shoes
- Costumes cannot promote use of drugs, alcohol, or violence of any kind
- Costumes may not be offensive or inappropriate in any way (ex: make fun of students, teachers, celebrities or genders)
- No inflatable costumes
- Sunglasses and hats are permitted as long as they are not dangerous or disruptive and must be removed in the classroom
- All makeup, hair and accessories must be done at home
- Costumes should not prevent the student from fully participating in learning activities (ex: students will still have PE this day, use good judgement)
- Follow all other dress code rules as state in the student handbook
- Building administration has the right to require students to change their apparel if it is deemed that the costume is not appropriate for school. If a change of clothing is not available, students will be required to put on clothes provided from the school.

Our school utilizes the SchoolMessenger system to deliver text messages, straight to your mobile phone with important information about events, school closings, safety alerts and more.*

You can participate in this free service* just by sending a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to our school's short code number, 67587.

You can also opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "Stop".

SchoolMessenger is compliant with the <u>Student Privacy</u> <u>PledgeTM</u> so you can rest assured that your information is safe and will never be given or sold to anyone.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes: SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.

If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes: SMS significa "servicio de mensajes cortos" y comúnmente se conoce como un "mensaje de texto". Nuestro proveedor de notificación, SchoolMessenger, utiliza un cierto protocol SMS desarrollado por la industria de las telecomunicaciones específicamente para enviar mensajes de texto en masa, referido como mensajes de texto "código corto." Este método es rápido, seguro y muy confiable, y está estrictamente regulado por los proveedores de servicios inalámbricos y sólo permite el acceso a los proveedores aprobados.
