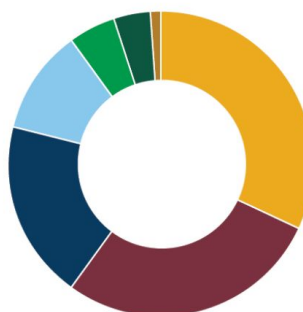

## GLOBAL SERVICE LEARNING



Through a Lakeside endowed program, students live for a month in rural areas of the developing or near-developing world, preceded by a week of on-campus learning about the culture, language, and economic and environmental context of their country. While abroad, Students work on projects that are identified as high-need by the host community, learning to understand a community's priorities, as well as contribute to projects that their host communities would not be able to complete without assistance. Recent locations include French Polynesia, Ecuador, China, Costa Rica, Senegal, Tanzania, and Thailand.

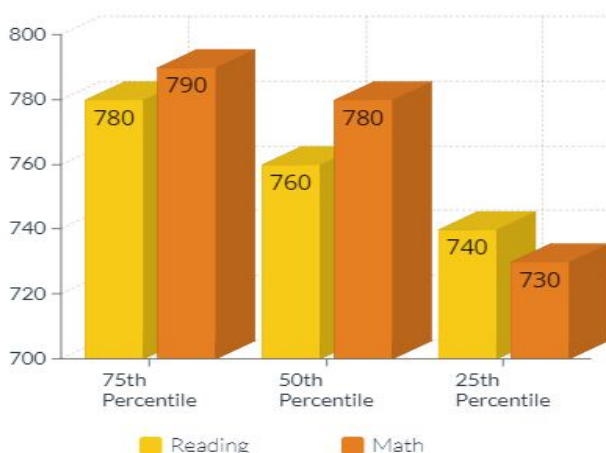

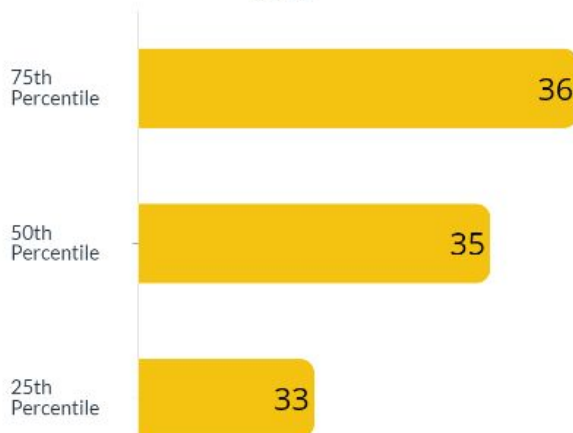
