2024-2025 Prekindergarten Family Engagement Plan

Brownwood Independent School District (BISD) believes that parental involvement is pivotal to our students' success. Beginning in prekindergarten, our district and campus administrators, teachers and other staff strive daily to facilitate relationships with students and their families that create an environment where children can thrive.

The Texas Administrative Code Rule §102.1003 defines family engagement as, "The mutual responsibility of families, schools, and communities to build relationships to support student learning and achievement and to support family well-being and the continuous learning and development of children, families, and educators."

At the district and campus levels, our missions and goals include family engagement. In our BISD Parent Involvement Policy, we encourage opportunities for parents to be involved such as encouraging children to prioritize their education, hold children accountable for completing schoolwork, familiarizing themselves with school-related events and activities, communicating with staff regarding opportunities available, monitoring academic progress, contacting campus personnel when needed, volunteering, serving on planning committees, attending or watching board meetings, registering students through online registration and registering for School Messenger to stay up-to-date on current district and campus activities.

Additionally, our district and campuses prioritize building relationships by planning family engagement events, scheduling conferences regarding student achievement, providing avenues by which families can serve through Parent-Teacher Organizations and other volunteer capacities, and maintaining open lines of communication between home and school with reference to available opportunities, behavioral and academic concerns, accomplishments.etc.
