

## **Online or Virtual Support**




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The Action Plan is a tool to help enrolled schools manage tasks related to school health initiatives. Each school has one Action Plan, which can include items from any assessment.





<u>Declined</u> - the baseline response was a higher ranking answer (for example: Fully In Place) on the answer scale of the selected assessment than the latest response (for example: Under Development) Improved - the baseline response was a lower ranking answer (for example: Partially In place) on the answer scale of the selected assessment than the latest response (for example: Fully In Place) **Denominator**-The denominator for each topic is the number of schools that have responded to at least one question included in the selected assessment multiplied by the number of questions available in that topic.
