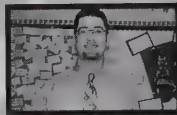
Interview

Johnny Luongo assisted customers with merchandise at Toys 'R' Us, located in Woburn, and even managed to win the Employee of the Month award.

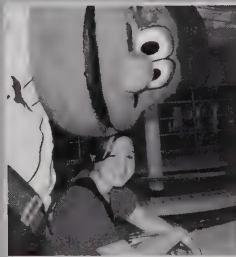

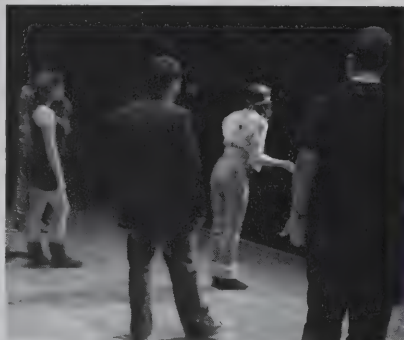




ONE ACTS

In four short years, senior Phil Galebach has turned himself into one of the most promising athletes that Medford High School has ever seen. Galebach recently chased down the state cross country title and he has an even greater future ahead of him.

So Phil, why do you run? How did you first get interested in running?

Well, I really enjoy winning, and running is almost relaxing for me. It has become my second nature. My older brother had a huge influence on me. He was a fairly good runner in high school and I kind of picked it up from him. I knew it was going to be my passion since the summer before freshmen year. I ran in the Hershey's Massachusetts Track Championship and won by running a 4:58 mile.

Wow, that's an impressive past. What are your current running achievements and what records are in store for the future?

As of right now, my best time in the 2-mile is 9:25. In the 5k I have a 15:45 and a 14:50 on track. I really enjoyed winning division 1 MA and the Manhattan invitational, but making it to Nationals was definitely my favorite achievement. Hopefully, I can break the 9-minute mark for two miles, and I really want to break the state record for the 5k.

Records like that must require a lot of practice. What is a normal week of practice like for you? Where do you run?

I usually practice in monthly cycles. I do about 100 miles a week for the first three weeks, and recover on another. I run all over Medford. Brice Canyon in Utah is one of my favorite places to run, but I also really enjoyed running in the Cascade Mountains and in San Diego. During my running weeks I do one speed workout and one long run each day and this prepares me for races.

What was the most challenging race you ever ran?

It was definitely the race where I qualified for Nationals. It was the most painful, but I really wanted to go to California. Also, the state championship was a very difficult race. During the race, I fell at the last hill before you descend to the field area at Franklin Park. Basically, I took the turn too sharply and my left foot slipped from under me.

Yet you were still able to win first place?

Yeah. I didn't really think about the fall that much because I just wanted to catch the two runners ahead of me.

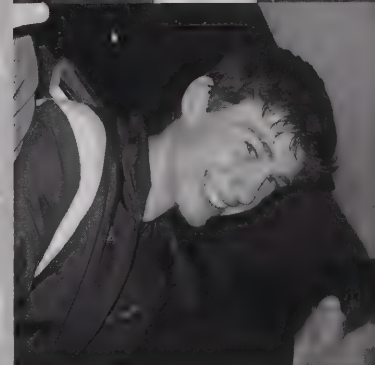
Where will we see and hear about Phil Galebach in the future?

I will be running with the Harvard team next year. I hope to qualify for Nationals and hopefully I will be able to become an All-American Runner. Basically, I will continue to lower my times, and if things go well I'm planning to start marathoning.

Yeah. That's one of the biggest marathons, so I'd like to try it.
