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The International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP) offers high-performing students an opportunity to pursue a rigorous program of studies during their high school years. The IB Diploma is widely accepted at universities and colleges throughout the world. Students pursuing the IB Diploma meet international standards of proficiency in:

**Language A – English**

**Mathematics**

**Experimental Sciences**

**Language B – French or Spanish**

**Social Studies**

**Required Electives / Arts**

Additionally, to receive the IB Diploma, students must satisfactorily complete a 4,000 word extended essay, CAS participation and reflections (including Creative, Action, and Service activities), and the Theory of Knowledge course. Students must also meet all other graduation requirements of Williamson County Schools and the State of Tennessee. To provide every opportunity for success, the IB Program calls for students to complete a course of studies in ninth and tenth grade referred to as Pre-DP. Throughout their four years in high school, IB students will **roughly** follow the program of studies below (schedule variations are certainly possible):

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The IB Diploma requires students to be well-rounded in all major academic areas, as well as active in serving the community. It necessitates students to develop thinking skills in every core academic area, in addition to world language and the required elective. Additionally, our Pre-DP students attend monthly meetings that facilitate program awareness prior to DP application. For students only seeking challenge in one or two core academic areas, there are strong AP and dual enrollment programs in place throughout Williamson County Schools.

STATEMENT OF INTENT:

- We have read the pre-diploma program (Pre-DP) literature and commit our support to participation.
- We understand that meeting the eligibility requirement does not ensure admission to the actual diploma program and that the decision by the selection committee will be final.
- If selected to the program, we do plan to participate, and we agree to notify the FHS IB Coordinators as soon as possible if our plans regarding participation in the IBDP change or if we will seek changes in a course schedule.
- Successful completion of the IB diploma program currently qualifies IBDP students for high school graduation. Should we leave the IB Program, our student must return to his/her zoned school and meet all graduation requirements specified by Williamson County Schools and the state of Tennessee.
- The Pre-IB and IB diploma programs require students to engage in school counseling services, and we understand that if we do not consent to school counseling services, we cannot participate in either program.
