Have you ever seen anyone get bullied? Unfortunately, bullying is a common occurrence in school. Many students live in fear every day of getting bullied. Some students get bullied about how they look, how they are dressed, their

conditions, or how big or small they are.



Together, we need to put that to a stop. If you know anyone that is

getting bullied, there are ways to stop it and to help others when it is needed.

National Stop Bullying Day occurs on October 9th and was initiated in 2009 by a group of sixth graders at the St. Stanislaus Kostka School. These students set out to dedicate the second Wednesday of October to raise awareness about bullying and encourage communities to fight against it. The purpose of this day was to prevent further bullying, to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. In addition, a holiday called "Pink Shirt Day" was also created. The original event was organized in 2007 by two grade 12 students named David Shepherd and Travis Price of Berwick, Nova Scotia who bought and distributed 50 pink shirts after a ninth-grade student, Chuck McNeill was bullied for wearing a pink polo shirt during the first day of school, and is used to raise awareness of bullying.

One student that has experienced bullying is La'ron Barnes. When asked what bullying is in his, he explained that bullying is when someone is "messing with another person because they are bored or

want attention from people, or just want to fit in with a group of people that are bad influences." When asked if he had ever been bullied, he replied, "Not really." But, he went on to explain that people laughed at him sometimes due to his weight, and that this happened in his early years here at Salmen. Luckily, no one laughs or calls him big or fat anymore. When people laughed at him, he



remembered not to take it to heart because he is happy with himself. He also explained that he didn't let them turn him into a bully by making conflict with the people that were laughing and calling him names. Instead, he took the high road and just walked away without letting their words hurt him or make him do anything that he would regret later. So if you are in a similar situation like La'ron, don't let anyone tell you what you are or make you feel a way about yourself. Just be yourself and keep walking! But it was more known in Maryland and southern colonies. By the late 18th century, there was a shift in the way that the United States had transformed Halloween into a celebration centered around community and friendly gathering rather than on ghosts, tricks, and magic. Therefore, by the early 1900s Halloween gatherings for both kids and adults had turned into the most popular method of commemorating the occasion. However these gatherings were centered around activities, seasonal dishes, and celebratory attire.


