Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

DID YOU KNOW?


- · Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- · Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- · Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up.
 Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 related medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- If you are concerned that your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your child must stay home due to illness or quarantine, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.

Healthy Bedtime Routine & Wait Until 8th Pledge- As we dive into the school year, I wanted to share a quick tip for supporting your child's success: a healthy bedtime routine and smartphone free!

For kids ages 5-12, it's crucial to get 9-12 hours of sleep each night. To help achieve this, try to set a bedtime routine that includes no electronics at least one hour before bed. Instead, consider winding down with a bedtime story. Reading together not only helps relax your child but also boosts their literacy skills and strengthens your bond.

Smartphones can be distracting and potentially harmful for children. They are becoming widespread in elementary and middle schools due to unrealistic social pressures, changing how kids spend their time. Activities like playing outdoors, spending time with friends, and reading are often replaced by hours on social media and video platforms.

Parents may feel overwhelmed by this shift, but community support can make a difference. Consider joining the Wait Until 8th Pledge, which encourages delaying smartphone use until at least the end of 8th grade. By signing this online pledge, you commit to holding off on giving your child a smartphone until then, provided at least 10 families from your child's grade and school also pledge. Once the pledge is active, you'll receive a list of other participating families, helping you connect with like-minded parents.

To help establish a consistent bedtime routine, I've included an example of a bedtime routine chart that you're welcome to use. Let's work together to ensure our kids are well-rested and free from unnecessary distractions. Your support can make a significant impact!

By signing the pledge at waituntil8th.org, you promise not to give your child a smartphone until at least the end of 8th grade as long as at least 10 families total from your child's grade and school take the pledge.

Wait Until 8th started with a few parents in Texas and a simple idea. If theyrallied together, they could reverse the power of peer pressure as smartphone ownership invaded their elementary schools.

Brooke Shannon led the charge to start a nationwide campaign asking parents to wait until their kids finished 8th grade to grant smartphone privileges, citing concerns over social and relational impairment, as well as addiction, distraction, depression, and exposure to mature content.
