Fall Parties

On Thursday, October 31st, we will celebrate with Fall parties and our annual costume parade, which will begin at 3:00 PM. Students may wear their costumes to school. Parents who plan to attend the parade or party can check in at the office starting at 2:50 PM. Please remember to bring your ID for check-in. If your child wears their costume during the day, please note the following guidelines:

- Masks: Masks are allowed only during the parade and party.
- Shoes: Students must wear appropriate shoes for recess and gym activities.
- **Costume Layering:** One-piece costumes should be worn over weather-appropriate clothing in case your child chooses to remove the costume during the day.
- Restroom Breaks: Keep in mind that one-piece costumes can be challenging when using the restroom.
- Inflatable Costumes: Inflatable costumes are allowed only during the parade and party.
- Outdoor Play: Recess will take place as usual, so students must be dressed for outdoor play.
- Forget Your Costume: Please bring it to the office by noon.
