



Please submit your request by the last day of the month in order to be considered at the Executive Board Meeting. Please give request money at least a month before you need it so that we can ensure funding is available.



How Can I Help My Child Apply for College?

Applying to colleges might sometimes feel difficult or overwhelming. Learning about the different types of college applications ahead of time will help you and your child feel more prepared when it comes time to complete them. You can also encourage your child to use CaliforniaColleges.edu to store important documents, keep track of deadlines, and even launch some college applications.

Once your child's **College List** is complete, it is time to start preparing for the application process. There are five different types of applications you and your child should know about when applying to college. Three of them are for public colleges in California:

- **CCCApply:** for almost all California Community Colleges (CCCs)
- **Cal State Apply:** for all California State University campuses (CSUs)
- **UC Application:** for all University of California campuses (UCs).
- **Common Application (Common App):** for more than 800 public and private four-year colleges in the U.S. and abroad.
- **School-Specific Applications:** for colleges and universities that have their own application.

Check with your child's school counselor about family information nights or other events that can help you support your child's transition from high school to college. If your child is still undecided about which college to attend, learn about how you can [help your child find the right college fit](#).

Be sure to discuss finances with your child and determine what you may be able to contribute to their college education. Learn about the many [financial aid options](#) available to help make college affordable.
