Veterinary Science Program

The Veterinary Science Program is an Academic Pathway designed to put students on a pathway to be prepared for a career or secondary education in the Animal Science, Medical or Veterinary Science field. In order for a student to be eligible for the pathway and certification exam, the following must be completed:

- Application Process Completion for 9th grade students in Spring semester
- Acceptance Requirements met to include Parent/Student meetings
- Academic & Program Contract Agreements for Students & Parents
- 100 Course Lessons from Texas A&M Veterinary Science Certificate Program
- 300 hands on clinical hours with licensed Texas DVM or LVT
- Apply and complete certification exam after successful completion of program requirements

Students are still able to take Dual Credit, Dual Enrollment or AP Classes concurrently while in the Veterinary Science Pathway.
