staff. The role of the parents during this process is to speak up and advocate for the best and most efficient way the school can involve parents and family in the education of their students. The Parent and Family Engagement Policy is always available in English and Spanish to parents virtually or by hard copy at any time by request, and it is distributed during virtual Open House.

- 2. W.D. Surratt Elementary shall convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, to which all parents of participating children shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of their school's participation under this part and to explain the requirements of this part, and the right of the parents to be involved; Section 1116 (c)(1)

 - A parent and family needs survey are made available with various topics which parents can pick from at the beginning of each year. The counseling team arranges monthly meetings with those needs in mind. Parent and family meetings will be held virtually at various times and days.
- 4. W.D. Surratt Elementary shall involve parents, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of programs under this part, including the planning, review, and improvement of the school parent and family engagement policy and the joint development of the schoolwide program plan under section 1114(b) (Campus Improvement Plan), except that if a school has in place a process for involving parents in the joint planning and design of the school's programs, the school may use that process, if such process includes an adequate representation of parents of participating children this could include the site base committee; Section 1116 (c)(3)
