



CHARLES A. LEDDY

Last October one of the most dedicated of teachers in the Medford School system, Charles A. Leddy, instructor of English and Assistant Head of the Department of English in charge of composition in the elementary schools, "shuffled off this mortal coil" to quote Shakespeare of whom Mr. Leddy was a great admirer.

Though denied children of his own, Mr. Leddy devoted thirty-two years of his life to the interests of the adolescent, not only in Medford, but throughout the state of Massachusetts by his work in the American Legion Public Speaking project.

Both the students and teachers came to love him because of his sympathetic understanding, un-


failing courtesy, and brilliance of mind. His service to the Honor Society was highly valued by that somewhat exclusive group.

At the end of this school year one of our faculty will retire from his work here at Medford High School. His leaving will create a void which will not easily be filled, for his facets are many and his influence upon those with whom he has worked in the classroom and on the athletic field is tremendous. Arthur G. Terrill, teacher and coach, after thirty-eight years of teaching and twenty-nine years of coaching will retire. He has earned this luxury.

is over 310 wins and about 120 losses. This average is well above .700, a phenomenal figure in secondary school competition.

A graduate of Medford High School, Arthur G. Terrill went on to Tufts College, from which he was graduated in 1923. While at Tufts he starred in baseball and football. A chemistry major, he entered the teaching profession; one year in North Attleboro and thirty-eight years at Medford High School comprise the experience of this man.

All the pupils and teachers who have been associated with this teacher and coach join in wishing him the best in his retirement. The place will not be the same without the man who has been so modest and gentle in his daily work and play.

Larry Center, quarterback, was on target all day with his passes, but the receivers were having their troubles holding onto the ball.


The line was strong for the greater part of the game.

The entire team played a fine game against one of the best teams in the state.


Medford 14 Everett 44

Medford 55**Quincy 75**


