It's a good time to share the required annual health screenings that will be completed throughout the year. Each school district shall ensure that all students are provided with the opportunity to receive health screenings conducted by a school physician, school nurse, or other school personnel properly trained pursuant to *N.J.A.C.* 6A:16-2.2(I). The required screenings are outlined in the chart below.

| Screenings | Grade |
|--|----------------|
| Height, Weight, Vision, Hearing, Dental | Pre-K students |
| Height, Weight, Blood Pressure, Vision, and Hearing | Kindergarten |

If at any time, the parent chooses to decline these screenings, a written request must be sent to the attention of the school nurse.

Parents will be notified, in writing, of any screening results that are outside of the normal parameters.

Additional Information from Nurse Lexi... Please send in your PreK Student's proof of flu vaccination record

Dear Parent/Guardian of PreK Student

According to N.J.A.C. 8:57-4 Immunization of Pupils in School, students in preschool must provide the district with proof of vaccinations in order to attend school. Students are also required to have a physical on file.

At this time, we do not have proof of flu vaccination on file.



Documentation must be received by **December 20, 2024**. <u>Failure to provide proof of the flu</u> <u>vaccination will result in your child being excluded from our program and he/she will not be</u> <u>permitted to return to class in January.</u> If excluded, spot may be given up to another student who has been waiting to register.
