- October is College Knowledge month! All seniors received a visit in their English class from Mr. Shady and Ms. Katie last month to learn more about senior year, postsecondary planning, applying to college, financial aid and more. During October all MN state colleges and universities waive their application fees so it is FREE to apply! We encourage all seniors who are thinking about 2- or 4- year college after graduation to start applying now.
- College rep visit season is in full swing, Juniors and Seniors should regularly check their CCC Schoology group to sign up and see who will be here when.
- On October 5th we took 80 juniors and seniors to the National College Fair at the Minneapolis Convention Center to visit with over 150 colleges and universities!

- On October 17th we will be taking 80 juniors to Career Connect Day at the St. Paul RiverCentre to connect with a wide variety of career options and industry professionals!
- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is undergoing many changes and updates for the coming year and will open in December, not October 1 as in previous years. Visit fafsa.gov for more information. While you are waiting for the form to open, both students (seniors only) and parents/guardians (of seniors) should create an FSA ID to get a head start.

Wilder's SUD program is partnering with high schools across the Saint Paul School District to provide alcohol and substance use supports for students and their families. Our aim is to decrease overdoses and other concerns related to substance use by providing prevention education and support, consultations for students, families and school faculty.

- Wilder's SUD Team is on-site at Harding, Humboldt, Central and Washington High Schools at least 2 days a week. Consultations are available by e-mail or phone Monday-Friday 9:00-3:00pm.
- **Team includes** Licensed Alcohol & Drug Counselors (LADC), Mental Health Professionals, Certified Peer Recovery Specialist and Mental Health/SUD Interns
- Other services provided through referrals: Substance use assessments (Rule 25/Comprehensive Assessments), individual SUD treatment, and outpatient or residential SUD Treatment.

If your child is absent from school, it is necessary for a parent/guardian to call the Attendance Hotline at 651-744-3063. Please leave the following information:

-Student name	-Student number
-Day and date(s) of absences	-Reason for the absence

If you need to pick up your student early, before the end of the school day, please call the office at least 2 hours in advance of the departure time.

Only certain reasons for being absent will be counted as excused. An absence is excused if it is for an illness, a medical appointment (mental health and dental count), religious holiday, or an extreme family emergency.

Unexcused absences are vacations, missed bus, car problems, needed at home, weather, or overslept.

Just because you call in does not mean the absence will be marked as excused.
