Beginning with the 2001-02 fiscal year, the financial health of every school district in Texas is evaluated as part of a financial accountability system known as School FIRST. The primary goal of School FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of school districts' financial resources, a goal made more significant due to the complexity of accounting associated with Texas' school finance system.

Eanes ISD has received a rating of

Superior

for 2024, the highest rating a district can achieve. The 2024 rating is based on an analysis of staff, student, budget, and audited financial data for 2022-23. Eanes ISD has received the highest possible rating for all years since 2003, the first year of implementation for the FIRST accountability system.

In 2021, the accountability standards were revised to include 20 indicators as compared to 15 in the prior year. In 2024, one additional indicator was added making it a total of 21 indicators. The FIRST rating is assigned to each school district based on indicators to measure critical financial management practices, ratios, and other indicators. These indicators provide a snapshot of the district's financial stability and management practices and include information about fund balance reserves, the annual financial audit, debt payments, and district expenditures.
