
SHOULD HALLOWEEN HAVE A CUT-OFF AGE? HALLOWEEN: IT'S NOT JUST FOR CHILDREN!

Matching the story telling, the tune portrays a sort of reminiscent aspect that remains stuck in my head the whole day! Overall, "Noah" is my favorite song on this album with amazing lyrics and tune.



Another one of my favorite songs is "Heaven By Noon," which tells a heartbreaking story of Megan Moroney losing someone close to her. She reveals the grief, guilt, anger, and confusion she experiences after receiving the news through imagery and telling lyrics. Her grief is apparent through the whole song, as she cries, can't find strength, and encounters many more upsetting emotions. Moroney shows her guilt in the lyrics, "I would've said so much more if I only knew / That you'd be in heaven by noon." These are definitely the most impactful lines in the song, since the listener imagines the guilt she feels after not being able to express feelings to this person before they passed away. It is heartbreaking to hear these as the final lines, because it ends the song on a sad note, as opposed to a happy ending, furthermore adding to how in times of grief, it can be hard to find silver linings. The melody of this song is soft, but of course catchy, creating a depressingly perfect song to listen to when feeling down.

WE CAN SURVIVE: CONCERT REVIEW

The We Can Survive concert sponsored by Auducy brought together a variety of people for mental health awareness on September 28. The artist lineup consisted of Justin Timberlake, New Kids On the Block, Tate McRae, Isabella LaRosa, Benson Boone, and Khalid.

The first artist, Isabella LaRosa sang three of her original songs and one cover of Lady Gaga's "Poker Face." She put on a decent performance with only her and her brother on stage. I hadn't heard of her before the concert, so she made an impact enough for me to search her up online after I left. She has a few viral songs on TikTok, which I have heard clips of, but I added one of her songs to my own personal playlist after her performance.

Benson Boone had quite a fan base at the concert. I had only heard of one song before his performance, which was the TikTok viral song "Beautiful Things." He took my breath away in his vocal quality with various ballots and impressive back flipping skills in between songs. To say the least, I was pleasantly surprised by his performance.

Khalid performed for the first time in five years and definitely made an impression on the audience. The crowd was singing all of his songs including, "Locatation," "Lovely," and "Eastside." His songs are easily recognizable and got the attention of even the older crowd. His combination of incredible vocals and simple dancing made his overall performance great. He also included background dancers and videos that related to each song on the big screen behind him, which I found amusing considering no one else had specific videos relating to their songs in their performances. Tate McRae by far had the best performance of the night. Opening with her song "Exs," she rallied the crowd into the loudest cheers. With her highly recognizable choreography, she took dance breaks in between each song and even had a costume change. McRae is personally one of my favorite artists, so I had a bias towards her performance, but I genuinely believed she entertained the whole audience with her powerful vocals and extreme dance moves.

New Kids on the Block disappointed me. I had previously seen them on tour in Boston a few years ago. Not much to my surprise, they kept the same exact act with the same songs and dance moves. I realize that they are in fact catering to the older generation that grew up with them, but their performance was bland and repetitive. I was not a huge fan of any of their songs either, but I was surprised at their lack of originality and ability to change with the modern music industry.

Justin Timberlake pleasantly surprised me with his performance. He played all of his hit songs, which had the audience screaming and was a refreshing set after New Kids on the Block. He played both his newer and older songs. I was shocked by his dance moves, which had my jaw dropped. Alongside Tate McRae his performance was a close second. The visuals he had on the big screens related to his songs, as well, similar to Khalid. He was committed to the performance and really enjoyed himself on stage. Overall the concert was incredible. Besides some disappointing unoriginality in some other artists, Tate McRae, Justin Timberlake, and Khalid carried the event. I would recommend seeing another event sponsored by Auducy again. 




CELEBRATING HISPANIC HERITAGE

The Conjuring Series



• Ghost









