### **NEW TO MERCERSBURG ACADEMY**

- » In 2022-2023, Mercersburg Academy introduced Earned Honors in select courses. Students may earn honors credit in these courses by fulfilling honors criteria throughout the school year; honors credit is assigned at the conclusion of the school year in accordance with these criteria. In many cases, courses formerly designated as Honors are now facilitated as Earned Honors.
- » In a standard curriculum, students in grades 11 and 12 will complete five credits per term, earning no more than four credits in Advanced Studies (AS) per term.
- » For the 2024-2025 school year, Mercersburg Academy has suspended its annual intensive. In previous years, all students participated in the Mercersburg Intensive, an immersive experience in which students and teachers worked as equal learners to explore a topic, genre, question, theme, or skill.

#### MERCERSBURG ACADEMY PROFILE

- » Founded in 1893; a coeducational boarding and day school enrolling students in grades 9-12 and offering a postgraduate year.
- 3 452 students from 29 states and the District of Columbia and 31 countries; 37 percent of students identify as a student of color; 48 percent of students receive financial aid.
- 3 4:1 student-to-faculty ratio; average class size of 12 students.
- » 100 percent of graduates attend a four-year college or university.
- » Accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

#### **ACADEMIC PROGRAM**

- » Advanced Studies (AS) represents the highest level of rigor in all academic disciplines. In most cases, students may complete a maximum of four credits in AS per term.
- Students in grades 9 and 10 earn 5-6 credits per term (17-18 credits per year), while students in grades 11 and 12 earn 5 credits per term (15 credits per year). Students will receive a grade of record in each course at the conclusion of each trimester.
- » Successful completion of a capstone experience (MAPS or Springboard) is a graduation requirement for all seniors.

- » Springboard courses are designed using the Challenge-Based Learning model. Each course culminates in studentdesigned projects that are publishable, permanent, or publicly viewable.
- MAPS is a selective two-year program for 25-30 11th and 12th graders. The 11th-grade experience—called *Thought*, *Knowledge*, *αnd Belief*—reinforces a student's ability to examine the depth and value of how they search for solutions and truth so that in 12th grade, they can conduct research for a 30- to 50-page SEARCH project, a high school equivalent of a master's thesis.

#### STATEMENT ON GPA AND RANK

Mercersburg Academy does not report GPA or class rank. We strongly believe in multiple entry points for students and intentionally grow the class each year. Therefore, a cumulative GPA would not accurately reflect the Mercersburg experience, as it would include grades from many different institutions. Official grades for all courses attempted are reported on the transcript.

#### STATEMENT ON DISCIPLINE

While seeking to develop self-discipline and responsibility in every student, Mercersburg recognizes the importance of clear boundaries and resulting consequences for overstepping those boundaries in a successful community. Though Mercersburg does not report disciplinary infractions to post-secondary institutions, students are counseled and expected to self-report the details of final warnings, suspensions, and required withdrawals if asked.
