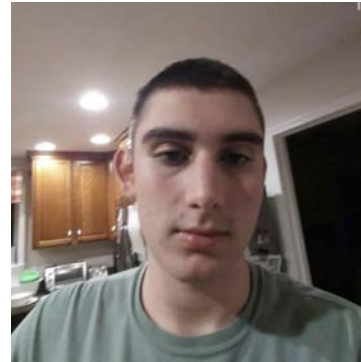

Election Day on the Way

Election day is only a week and a half away, on Tuesday, November 5, and presidential candidates Donald Trump and

Kamala Harris are still on the campaign trail battling over swing states like Pennsylvania and Georgia. In particular, each is trying to gain the support of male Black and Latino voters, who make up some of the largest groups of undecided voters.

Recent polling from *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution* shows Trump leads Harris in approval ratings in Georgia at 47% to 43%, with a margin of error of 3.1%. Polls also show Trump with a slight lead in North Carolina and Georgia. Harris appears to have the lead in the other four swing states, however; these include Nevada, Michigan, Wisconsin, and, most importantly, Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania has 19 electoral votes, the most of any of the seven battleground states, so often, whoever takes Pennsylvania usually wins the White House. In fact, out of our last 12 presidents, 10 of them won Pennsylvania's electoral votes.

However, it's still too early to tell which way this election will go. By Tuesday, 17 million voters had already voted by mail, but that's out of roughly 244 million adults eligible to vote in America. That includes some of the students here! To all of you over the age of 18: remember to go out and vote on November 5 at the Hamilton Public Library or whichever voting location is closest to you.

Gaza's Hospitals Become Battlegrounds

The war has done a lot of damage with power outages and shortages putting nearly every hospital in Gaza out of service, in the first two months of Israel's war against Hamas there were twenty out of twenty-two hospitals damaged or destroyed. There were fourteen hospitals that were directly hit. This war has left many people injured and killed. In the beginning of the war the first strike left 1,200 people killed, and 240 people had been taken hostage. In the two months of the war there were a total of 17,100 people dead, and more have been taken, on January 12, 2024 there were over 23,400 people who had died.



Hamas operated inside and underneath the hospitals and used them as military operations. They were using the hospitals as storage for their weapons, and using them as command centers, and keeping their hostages. The attacks on the hospitals have affected the health system and many people along with it. They set up shelters for food and care, but without a hospital many were dying. They were all in need of service more than ever before!

Bomb Threats Hurt Travel in India

On October 21st, 2024 there was an unprecedented surge of hoax bomb threats targeting Indian Airlines, causing many problems such as messing up flight schedules, diverting planes, and causing a lot of disruption with the Airlines in India. A video that was posted last week was showing passengers "draped in woolens", and they were walking down the icy ladder of an Indian plane into the cold air of Iqaluit, a city in Canada.



Approximately 211 people that were on route from Mumbai to Chicago, were diverted on October 15th, 2024 due to a bomb threat. One of the passengers Harit Sachdeva said "We have been stuck at the airport since 5 am with about 200 passengers, we have no idea what is happening or what we are supposed to do next, we are completely stranded". Harit Sachdeva praised the "kind airport staff" and he told the staff how Air India wasn't doing enough to let these passengers know what was going on.

Travis Scott’s *Utopia* takes listeners on a boundary-pushing journey that blends his signature trap sound with new experimental elements. Released in July 2023, the album is packed with star-studded features, including



Drake, Beyoncé, Playboi Carti, Future, and Kid Cudi. The album opens with "HYAENA," setting a heavy tone with intense beats, and tracks like "MODERN JAM"

feature eerie synths and sonic complexity. Fans particularly highlighted songs like "MELTDOWN" (featuring Drake) for its boldness and controversial lyrics.

Utopia stands out for its conceptual approach and bold production choices. 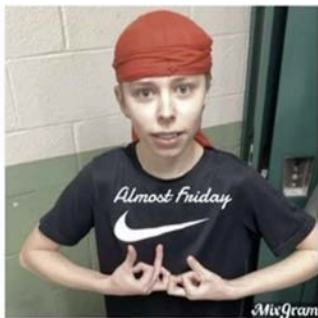
