

### The Last Day

Can it be? Is this really our last day at school? Is today the very last time that we shall dash down this corridor to make a fifth period class? The last time we shall have to maneuver our way through labyrinths of hungry students to buy lunchroom tickets? Can this really be the last time that we shall have to prepare recitations, keep notebooks, and do a hundred other methodically tiresome duties?

Why, yes, of course! This is the last day of school, the end of our Senior year. For most of us, today marks the termination of twelve long long years of report cards, sandwiches, erasers! Strange, that we do not feel liberated, triumphant as we thought we should. Strange, that all we feel is a choking lump in our throats, a nervous sinking sensation in our hearts. And that moisture about our eyes, could it possibly be tears?

In most cases, it is tears: tears of gratitude for our classmates, our teachers, and our Headmaster with whom we are reluctant to part, because with them we share memories as ineffaceable as the heavens. We are experiencing that sinking sensation because deep in our hearts we know that never, never again can we recapture the delightful buoyancy of youth that has been ours at Medford High School. Knowing this, we find it difficult to sever the carefree, idyllic days of the past from the uncertain ones ahead. But the break is inevitable, and we, the class of 1943, will face this world with a song in our heart—a song that sings of spring proms and swishing skirts, of perspiring athletes and adoring girls, of crowded lunchrooms and chattering classmates: a song of us, the Class of 1943.

As a War Class we had to make sacrifices. Insignificant ones really when compared to those that the boys over there were making for us over here. Because of lack of fuel to heat rehearsal rooms the timeless tradition of presenting a Senior Class Play had to be disposed of, and more than one aspiring actress had to toss her aspirations to the four winds. Sometimes we had to leave our coats on during school because of the low temperature. Ice-cream, our favorite dessert, was rationed together with sugar, coffee, shoes, and canned goods, but on Mondays and Wednesdays, some lucky individual actually got ice cream at the cafeteria. Pleasure driving was unpatriotic, so that cars for school formals could not be had for love nor money. Even private busses could not be obtained for the athletic teams which had to travel on public cars carrying pounds of equipment with them. But to us, these discomforts were mere trivialities, for we realized that this was war in all earnestness, and accordingly, we adjusted ourselves to a war tempo.



Junior Officers We took our studies more seriously in order that we might better equip ourselves for our future role in world affairs. Many of us took on greater responsibilities. During Christmas week and the school-less month of February instead of vacationing in the movies as we used to do in earlier years, we vacationed in the Boston department stores as stock boys and sales girls, and still others enrolled in educational courses in the nearby private schools. Many took advantage of Mr. Kendall's working plan, and through the guiding genius of Mr. Manley, they acquired positions in stores and offices.

Led by Jack Newby, president of the House of Delegates, we executed one of the most successful drives for war salvage materials in the city. As an added incentive, Mr. Kendall had a huge collection bin placed on our front lawn, for all the world to see how patriotic Medford High School

students could be.

Besides first aid courses given by the untiring Miss Neilson and Miss Luce, Mr. Pidgeon again organized the decontamination squad for the fighting of war gases, and several teachers gave nightly instruction in such courses as celestial navigation, aeronautics, and mathematics. Mr. Lang, physical education director, inaugurated a Victory Corps with six divisions: general, community, land sea, air, and production.

Remember Tag Day and Senior Bond Week? On those two occasions alone, we Seniors purchased over six thousand dollars of bonds and stamps. Indeed, so patriotic were we that Henry Corrado's shoelace brought forth a bid of \$32.00 from Jackie Glidden and Company at our incomparable bond

auction.

However, we were not concerned merely with war work and war records. Athletically, scholastically, and socially we also did excel.

Who will ever forget our immortal football team? Who will ever forget that Thanksgiving Day when the shy, unassuming Corrado went over for the all important touchdown, thereby ceding the Eastern State Champion-

ship to Medford? Can we ever forget the spine-ting-ling plays of Co-Captains Trainor and O'Brien, of Zucco, Romsey, McCarthy, and the speed-king Cannava? What a team! It was the tops, and it made us prouder than a new father when it breezed away with the State Championship; but none were so proud as the indefatigable Coach Pidgeon, and his able assistants, Coaches Ricker and Murphy.

Sophomore Officers



Our soccer and baseball teams, led by the versatile co-captains, Trebino and Tortorella, represented us nobly also. The soccer team captured the league lead, cup and all under the brilliant playing of such stars as Pinto, Toumayan, and Morrison.

In basketball and hockey, with Cervone and Garrity as respective captains, Medford reached even greater heights; and names like Tryder, D'Entremont, Warner, Trebino, Hale, Anderson, Zucco, and Desmond loomed brightest.

Newby and McCrystal piloted the indoor and outdoor track teams respectively to state-wide glory, and to Robinson, Hardy, Miller, Sedgeberg, and the captains goes much of the credit.

The girls also were better than average in sports. Phyllis Corbin, the most outstanding of them all, captained the softball and basketball teams with the graceful, unerring hand of the true athlete she is. Pat Blaine, Dot West, Ann Willard, Dot Bizier, Mary Reynolds, Eileen Sullivan, and Dot Twoomey composed the majority of Senior girls who participated in these sports.

Socially, we were responsible for the overwhelming financial and social success of our proms. Remember President Jimmy Clear at our hop a la tux? And Lucille Shea, our vivacious vice president, certainly was the charming hostess of the evening. Efficient Marjorie Moran and the popular Walter Kisluk, as secretary and treasurer made us justly proud; and all night long the orchestra played "My Sister and I."

The following year at our Junior Prom Arthur Castraberti stood in the receiving line as class president. Blond Marjorie Brooks, our vice president, and brunette Shirley MacMillan, our secretary, followed close by, the essence of femininity in their sweeping gowns and colorful corsages. Walter Kisluk, (we entrusted him with our money another year) kept pulling at his tight tuxedo collar, but in spite of the neck irritation, we knew he was enjoying himself. This year starry-eyed couples waltzed to the strains of "I Don't Want to Walk Without You" and "Somebody Else Is Taking My Place." Remember?

Scholastically, we led the entire school in our sophomore and junior years by placing more students on the honor roll than did the other classes. At one quarter or another, Elizabeth Maioli, Henry Hockheim, Arthur Anderson, Harold Wykes, Vesta Starrett, Phyllis Clark, Jean Taggert, and Lewellyn Blake, attained highest honors. We also had our share of intellectual geniuses. William Shea, high honor student, was seldom seen taking books home, and Robert Clark wrote several editorials which were printed in the Boston Herald. Viviane Bertolami, the concert violinist, played in numerous symphonies, and Harold Wykes, the personification of versatility, was the top-notch scholar and model airplane designer all in one. Paul McGinnis, our keen-witted, affluent orator and Senior class president, officiated at all assemblies with the poise and presence of a professional speaker. For these of our classmates, we know success is just ahead.

Yes, we the class of 1943, worked hard and played hard. With the chaotic world conditions around us, we realized more acutely that the seemingly common-place activities of high school days were to be the foundation of happiness and security on which we would later build our lives. When it came time for us to be thrust into the surging whirlpools of war-living, we knew that all we would have to cling to would be the normalcy and the contentment that we knew in high school years. Therefore, whole-heartedly, with Paul McGinnis, president; gracious Doris Farnum, vice president; popular Ruth Haselton, secretary; determined Dave Preston, treasurer; and likable Joseph Cincotta, acting treasurer, we made certain that we should extricate every existing drop of fun and laughter from our Senior year at Medford High School. And we did!

As sophisticated Seniors we delighted in directing uncertain sophomore boys to the girls' gym and vice-versa. We liked making our underclassmen feel as insignificant as we had once been made to feel. It was all part of the act of "being a senior."

Then spring drew near, and our boys—boys with whom we had laughed and danced and sung, suddenly were not boys any longer, but rather stern, serious men leaving for the man-sized job of war. Sedgeberg, Conway, Romsey, Urquhart, and O'Brien answered to their country's call.

June drew near, and we Seniors had to shed every semblance of sophistication, because, yes, that's it—because we were getting sentimental. We looked long and searchingly at our classmates, for we knew that graduation would soon separate us from them, but somehow we wanted them to know how much we loved and appreciated them, but somehow the words could not come out. Homely, much-taken-for-granted objects grew sacred to us. With reverence we now shut our lockers in which we never again would toss paper-filled, uncovered books, and chewed-up pencils. It had come to this: sophisticated Seniors mooning over cold, impersonal lockers and chewed-up pencils and uncovered books.

Before we knew it, it was the last day of school—today; and today here we stand with fond memories of the side-splitting antics of Jackie Glidden and Arthur Castraberti, of the refreshing charm of Betty O'Neill, of the quiet intelligence of Elso Del Vecchio, of the boundless energy of Mary Cronin, of the contagious laughs of Claire Morrissey and Abbott Cofran. Other classes may have their share of Alongis, Richenbachers, Kisluks, and Trainors; they may even have their share of Bradleys, Guerentes, Coneys, and Furrs. But somehow, our class will always have that superiority of spirit which made war-living bearable.

And now, our Senior year is over. The time has come for us to leave forever these halls of learning, brimming over with the youthful music of schoolday joys. Today, we must stand with one hand closing the door on a sheltered, happy past and with the other, opening the door on a troubled future. But we are not afraid, because we are the Class of 1943, the class whose fighting American spirit is to be found everywhere in this world.

September 19, 1942

Medford 18 Watertown 0

There were five thousand fans cheering the outbreak of the spectacular undefeated season. The Watertown team, Class B, played to fill the schedule for the opening game. Cannava made the first touchdown from the opponent's twenty-third yard line. Corleto, one of our best linemen, was injured in the second quarter. Corrado made six more points in the third, and Morehouse scored the final touchdown. Our rivals sustained injuries throughout the entire game. This outset was a forerunner of the successes of the season.

September 26, 1942

#### Medford 19 Leominster 0

Medford was chosen the underdog of this contest. Behind the brilliant playing of Hank Corrado and Co-Captain O'Brien, however, the Mustangs soon held the upper hand. Hank threw two touchdown passes, one to Charlie

Ramsey and the other to Dave Aznavoorian. He then hammered his way across the goal line for one more touchdown. Co-Captain O'Brien was outstanding although all of the linemen did spectacular work. Paul intercepted no less than three of the visitor's passes, putting a stop to Leominster's passing attack. Joe Granelli did a grand job at calling signals while he was for substituting Co-Captain Bill Trainor who was on the side lines because of an injury. The substitutes did an exceptionally good job.

#### October 3, 1942

#### Medford 22 Brockton 7

After Brockton scored a first period touchdown, the Mustangs exploded. The score little demonstrated the superiority of the Medford team. In the first quarter a series of passes rang up Medford's first touchdown; the try for the extra point missed. Just before the quarter ended, sensational runs by Cannava and Corrado set up another score, which was made on a 30-yard pass from Corrado to Cannava. Again the try for the extra point missed. In the second quarter Brockton drove to the Mustangs' 2-yard line, but the visitors were pushed back to the 9-yard line where Medford took over. An exchange of punts put Brockton behind its own goal line. A Brockton punt was blocked, and Medford scored on the safety. The final score came on the combined efforts of Al Cannava and Henry Corrado. Corrado booted the extra point. This victory proved Medford's right to the foremost rank in schoolboy football circles.

#### October 12, 1942

#### Medford 32 Somerville 0

Over twelve thousand fans watched Medford's formidable Mustangs keep the famous jinx alive by crushing an outmanned Somerville eleven 32—0. The Mustangs in registering their fourth consecutive victory scored in every period to ring up the largest score of the season. Al Cannava started the scoring in the initial period by sprinting twenty yards on a reverse, while Co-Captain Bill Trainor scored on a 3-yard plunge in the second period. In the third period the Blue and White tallied twice; first, when Jim Sullivan grabbed a deflected pass and ran some 20-odd yards for the tally, and again





when Al Cannava behind devastating blocking, galloped 75 yards for the fourth touchdown. In the fourth period with the second team operating, Jim Sherwood ended the scoring by speeding around right end for 30 yards and 6 more points. Cannava and Gatti each added an extra point to make the total 32. Once again the entire Medford team and Al Cannava, in particular, were outstanding.

#### October 17, 1942

#### Medford 21 Chelsea 0

From the sound of the opening whistle until the game ending whistle, Medford outplayed a very weak Chelsea eleven. The forward line of the Mustangs, which was very strong throughout the game, was breaking up all the plays of the "Red Devils." The first score of the game came when Chelsea, unable to penetrate Medford's mighty line, tried for a field goal. Al Cannava, the set back of the Mustangs caught the ball and raced 102 yards in and out of the Chelsea team for a touchdown. The score remained 7-0 up to the half, but when Cannava returned the opening kickoff of the second half 85 yards for another touchdown, it sent the score to 14-0. The last score of the game came when Coach Pidgeon inserted the second team. Jim Sherwood, a promising back scored the last touchdown on a short sprint.

#### October 24, 1942

#### Medford 20 Everett 0

Al Cannava, who had run wild in previous games, continued his great running by taking the opening kickoff back 85 yards for a touchdown. Two other touchdowns came in the last three minutes of play. One came when Corrado crashed over from the 4-yard line, after Cannava had set up the score by a 45-yard sprint. The final score came on Morehouse's flashy return of an Everett punt. By this 20—0 triumph, Medford took an undisputed hold on first place in Class A.

#### October 31, 1942

#### Medford 25 Mt. Pleasant 0

On October 31, the Mustangs continued to gallop on their undefeated path by flattening the Mt. Pleasant eleven from Rhode Island, 25—0. Henry Corrado, Al Cannava, and Joe

Gatti each scored to carry the team to victory. Ends Jim Sullivan and Charlie Romsey were in there snatching passes for the first two scores. Sullivan played, despite a slight touch of the

grippe.

In the first quarter, Romsey caught a Corrado pass, thrown from the Mt. Pleasant 26-yard line, and romped to the 1-yard line. Corrado accounted for the touchdown and then passed for the extra point. Failing to gain ground by passing in the second period, Corrado smashed through for a second score. Cannava galloped 33 yards to score again in period three. Joe Gatti, a sophomore, intercepted a Mt. Pleasant aerial on his own 34-yard line to run for a fourth period score to make the final score 25—0. As in previous games, the boys played clean and fought hard in order to make this their seventh straight win.

#### November 7, 1942

#### Medford 25 Waltham 0

Driving relentlessly toward the Class A and State Championships, the Mustangs pounded out a 25—0 win over Waltham for their eighth straight victory. Paced by the terrific power smashes of Hank Corrado, and the great broken field running of Al Cannava, they outplayed, outran, and outfought a game but befuddled Waltham eleven.

The scoring started when Hank Corrado, after a series of line plunges, broke through for six points early in the first period. The try

for the extra point failed.

The second tally was rung up at the start of the second period on the prettiest play of the afternoon. Al Cannava did the honors. Protected by the season's finest exhibition of blocking, he, taking a high punt at mid-field, raced down the left sideline for the goal unopposed. Again the try for the point after failed.

In the third quarter F ank Corrado streaked through the Waltham line for the third tally. Once more the try for the extra point missed.

In the final chapter a 25-yard Corrado to Romsey pass was completed to the Waltham 5, where I and Corrado went over for the fourth and final touchdown. The only extra point of the game was made on a dropkick by Joe Quigley, the Mustang's left tackle.



#### November 14, 1942

#### Medford 6 Arlington 0

When Coach Pidgeon's illustrious eleven met Fred Ostergren's leather luggers at Pierce Stadium in Arlington, they battled through what proved to be their toughest game. After the kickoff, our boys rolled down the field toward the goal. Then a Corrado pass was intercepted which dimmed the hopes of our lads. were soon revived, however, when Bill Trainor captured an enemy fumble. All-star Al Cannava expertly tore off two first downs placing the pigskin on the 2-yard line. From there Hank Corrado drove across for six big points. His conversion failed; therefore this tally in the first quarter ended the scoring. Although Arlington never threatened, Mel Massucco, back, and Ike Bevins, center, aided by a stiff wind successfully checked the Mustang attack. Outstanding in the game were the "C" twins, Romsey, Connie McCarthy, Captains Trainor and O'Brien.

#### November 26, 1942

#### Medford 13 Malden 0

The terrific Medford Mustangs crowned a glorious season by coming to life in the third period of their annual Thanksgiving day classic to down their arch rival, the hard-fighting Golden Tornado from Malden, by a 13—0 score. In addition to completing their season with the victories in as many starts and defeating the Golden Tornado for the third year in succession, the Mustangs became the first undefeated and untied Medford team since 1917 and the first Medford team to win the Massachusetts State Championship.

In the first period Medford refused to take advantage of several scoring opportunities. The Mustangs recovered several fumbles and blocked a punt, but their running and passing attack was halted five yards from the enemy goal line by an inspired Malden defense. The hard charging Medford forward wall entirely stopped the Malden offense, only allowing it to advance as far as the Medford 43-yard line.

The second half kickoff was taken on the Malden 48, and Medford's power and superiority soon came into light. After one attempt through the line was stopped for a 4-yard gain, Hank Corrado smashed off right tackle, cut back

through the center and veering toward the left, outdistanced all defenders to race 44 yards for the first score. The Malden safety man was taken out of the play by a beautiful block by Charlie Romsey, enabling Hank to go the distance. Hank also booted the extra point from placement with Bill Trainor holding. A blocked punt on the Malden 15-yard line by Johnny Zucco led to the second Medford score. Hank Corrado again went the distance on the exact play of his first touchdown. The try for the extra point failed.

The remainder of the game was featured by several dazzling runs by Al Cannava and a 40-yard dash for a touchdown by George Morehouse, only to have the play nullified by an offside penalty. Medford's superiority is clearly indicated by the statistics which show a net gain of 153 yards for the Mustangs against a total loss of 15 yards for the Tornados. "Hammering Hank" Corrado was the big gun in the Medford attack featuring the game with several long runs and getting off many spectacular kicks, in fact the entire team was immense, showing the fine team work, spirit, and co-ordination that has proved them the outstanding squad in Massachusetts.

One half of the time is devoted to actual shop work and the other half to related and academic work. The laboratory method of instruction which is used in the related classes is very closely correlated with the shop work. This close tie-up assures a thorough training in shop and technical information.

The school attempts to prepare the boy morally, intellectually, and physically for the vocation for which he seems to be best fitted by nature, ability, and opportunity; at the completion of his course the school places the student in the industry trained for, keeps in touch with his progress, and encourages his promotion.

Nor must we forget our Marie Silvestro, who so cleverly took over the whole administration of this, our Year Book.


