Review units 1-9 Letter Aa, Ee, Hh, Kk, Mm, Rr, Ss, and Ww.

while learning these new letters we will be reading stories that help us learn about eating well, stayin safe and keeping safe. We will continue to work on our cutting, gluing, coloring in the lines and organization. During our Morning routine we will continue to trace our name and check in emotionally on our emotion wheels, we are learning about what our faces look like and how our bodies feel when we are happy, angry, sad, confused, worried and tired. Parents you should know that your child check in every morning missing you, even if they are grumpy getting out the door!

Phonemic Awareness: Pre-K has been learning Alphabet Awareness, blending words, adding and taking away words, beginning and ending sounds, adding and deleting syllables, segmenting syllables, segments words, rhyming words, adding and deleting phenomes, some of our favorite nursery rhymes (language awareness) are Little Miss Muppet, 1 2 buckle my shoe and The Itsy Bitsy Spider.

Math

We have been having fun identifying numbers 0-5 with number Bingo! We have been counting backwards from 5-0. We have been counting how many days we have been in school (38). We have had lots of fun finding our different shapes around the room and outside. Our trickiest shape has been the Rectangle, and how its different from a square.

Shapes we will ne learning: Rhombus (diamond), oval, hexgon and octogon.


