Model Notification of Rights under FERPA for Elementary and Secondary Schools

The federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- (1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the School receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the School Principal, by mail to the School address or by hand in the Main office, a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The Principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. The School will make will make copies available to parents for free.
- (2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Parents or eligible students may ask the School to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the School Principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the School decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- (3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests.

A school official is a person employed by the School as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the School has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the School discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are:

Policy for Handling Complaints

Any individual or group ("complainant") may bring a complaint to the Board of Trustees, alleging a violation of the New York Charter Schools Act, the charter or other applicable laws relating to the management or operation of the school. In its efforts to address, respectfully, responsibly and promptly, the matter to the satisfaction of the complainant, the following procedures will be followed:

- 1. The Board delegates to the Executive Director the authority and responsibility to receive, consider and respond to all regular complaints relating to the management or operation of the school, except for special complaints that allege the Executive Director has violated a law or has engaged in official misconduct, in which case the complainant may bring the complaint directly to the Board's Complaint Review Committee. The Executive Director, as his/her discretion, may assign the Principal to handle complaints first and to refer in writing, to the Executive Director level, those which cannot otherwise be satisfactorily resolved.
- 2. As to complaints brought to the Executive Director, a complainant who is dissatisfied with the written response from the Executive Director, which must be provided within two weeks of receipt of the complaint, may bring the complaint to the Board's Complaint Review Committee.
- 3. The Board's Complaint Review Committee will entertain special complaints, as defined in step 1, above, or regular complaints that have been brought to the attention of the Executive Director and that the Executive Director has been unable to resolve to the satisfaction of the complainant.
- 4. The complaint may be presented to the Board in person, at an open meeting, or in writing, to the Chair of the Board.
- 5. Once the Board's Complaint Review Committee has determined that the complaint has previously been brought to the attention of the Executive Director or that it is a special complaint, as defined in step 1, above, the committee will give full attention to it, considering the statements of the complainant, the Executive Director and any other persons whose contributions may, in the opinion of the committee, be relevant.
- 6. If the complaint is in writing, it will be considered before the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board that is at least two weeks subsequent to the receipt of the complaint. If it is received in person at a Board meeting, it will be reviewed by the committee before the next scheduled Board meeting.
- 7. Within two weeks of its deliberations, the committee will respond in writing to the complainant, providing its determination, together with the "Guidelines of the Charter School Institute for Handling Complaints Received Pursuant to Education Law §2855(4)," including a copy of its "Grievance Form."
- 8. If the complainant determines that the Board of Trustees does not adequately address the complaint, the complainant may bring the complaint to the Charter Schools Institute.
- 9. If the complainant determines that the Charter Schools Institute, as representative of the Trustees of the State University of New York, does not adequately address the complaint, the complainant may bring the complaint to the Board of Regents.
- 10. The Trustees of the State University of New York and the Board of Regents have the authority, under the Charter Schools Act, to take appropriate action. Upon a determination being made by either body, copy of the determination will be transmitted to the complainant and the charter school involved in the action.

School Commitment

The Bronx Charter Schools for Better Learning will provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to develop to their fullest potential and in turn meet the State's student academic achievement standards. Our pedagogy is learning-centered and firmly rooted in the knowledge that every child learns by developing their own understanding. Therefore, all staff will subordinate their teaching to students' learning to always meet the needs of all students.

The School will:

- Ensure that all teachers are undergoing continual training in the methods and materials associated with the Subordination of Teaching to Learning approach.
- Hold frequent observations and discussions between classroom teachers and staff developers to continually monitor the progress of students.
- Ensure that designated professional staff meet frequently in small groups with at-risk children to address their individual learning needs and adjust instruction to their pace.
- Use quantitative and qualitative data to assess student progress in an on-going way and modify curriculum presentations to meet all students' needs.
- Provide access to technology and technical support for all families so that students are digitally savvy and responsible.

The Bronx Charter Schools for Better Learning will partner with parents and keep open communication to foster a healthy and robust home-school relationship.

The School will:

- hold parent-teacher conferences for all students twice a year (in late fall and early spring). For students in special populations (Special Education, MLL, PAT) conferences will be held at least three times a year, as part of the Pupil Assistance Team's effort to accelerate and intensify the learning experience of all student populations.
- provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress, through email and telephone calls home, progress reports and parent conferences as needed.
- provide parents reasonable access to staff. Staff will be available to discuss student progress after school or at a minimum within a week of a request being made.
- provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class activities.

Parent Commitment

We, as parents/guardians, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Y.E.S. I will model and practice the <u>Y.E.S</u>. initiative (Respect and Take Care of <u>Y</u>ourself, <u>E</u>ach other, and the <u>S</u>chool) while on campus and engaging with the School community.
- Timeliness/Attendance I understand that it's my responsibility to make sure my child is punctual every day. I commit to taking my child to school every day on time at 8:00 am.
- Support & Homework I will participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my
 child's education. I commit to assisting my child the best way I know how, to increase
 my child's learning opportunity. I will help my child to study, and review my child's
 work each week.
- Independent Reading In conjunction with the school's initiative on reading, I will
 insist that my child read every night.
- Communication I will stay informed about my child's education and communicate
 with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school either received via my
 child or email, and respond in a timely way, as appropriate via email or phone call.
- Uniform I will send my child to school every day in the BBL uniform. I understand
 that if my child is not in uniform, he or she may not be allowed in class and someone
 from my family will have to come to the school with the required clothing.
- School Rules I understand that BBL has very high behavior standards. I commit to
 making every effort to communicate and discuss these rules with my child and make
 sure that my child lives up to the standards. I understand that the purpose of these rules
 is to protect the safety and rights of all individuals.
- Attendance at Parent/Guardian Meetings I commit to attending all required parent/guardian meetings, including those scheduled to discuss my child's behavior. I will also make every reasonable effort to attend parent trainings and workshops offered by the School.
- Volunteering I will serve, to the extent possible, on the school's advisory groups and PTA, and attend monthly PTA meetings and Coffee and Conversation meetings.
