



PUPIL CONCERNS POLICY (YEARS 7 TO 13)

In this community your happiness is important to all of us. It is very important that you know somebody cares. In addition to your parents or guardian, there are always people at the College to help you with a problem. You could speak to:

- A friend

- Your House Master

If you are a boarder you could also tell your House Captain, Housekeeper/Matron, House Tutor Boarding Housemaster or Independent Listener.

If you are concerned about another pupil who seems unhappy for any reason, you should tell an adult you can trust. The other pupil may be too scared or lonely to speak to someone themselves.

Anything you discuss with the Chaplain, the Counsellor, staff in the Yelcho Room or the Independent Listener will remain confidential unless: (a) you agree it may be shared with others; or (b) they have a safeguarding concern about you or another young person (e.g. they are concerned that you or another young person may have suffered abuse or be at risk of abuse).
