In a rare occurrence this fall, neither of the Crockett County High School sports teams in action Tuesday night managed to sneak into the victory column.

Westview slipped past the Lady Cavalier soccer squad 2-1 at Cavalier Stadium despite an outstanding effort by Crockett goaltender Amaria Walker, who helped manage to keep the margin to one goal in a match in which the visiting Lady Chargers completely dominated possession of the ball.

Across the way in Bill Emerson Gymnasium, Dyer County continued its recent domination of District 13-AA volleyball by sweeping the Lady Cavs 3-0.

SOCCER: Westview kept the ball on the Crockett goal side of the field for close to 80% of the time and pounded 17 shots at the Lady Cav net, with Walker stopping 15 of them in every imaginable way. But the visitors split the defense once in each half to post the triumph, handing Crockett just its third defeat of the season.

"Westview is highly talented," Coach Carli Branson said. "We hustled all night and pushed through, but we couldn't seem to maintain possession. We take away a lot of lessons learned from tonight and apply those lessons into practice as preparation for the upcoming district tournament."

The Lady Chargers scored first in the contest and rarely allowed Crockett to advance the ball past midfield, but late in the first half – with just 2:18 to play – Braniya Green poked a shot in off a Nyah Cathey assist to deadlock it at 1-1. The second period was almost total domination by Westview, but Walker kept making amazing saves until the visitors punched one in with 18 minutes remaining.

VOLLEYBALL: Dyer County - a TSSAA State Tournament team last season, as was Crockett - returned the nucleus of that club this fall, while Coach Andrew Laman's Lady Cavs are breaking in a lot of youth into the rotation this year. The Lady Choctaws' advantages were evident Tuesday night as All-Stater Teagan Reed and 6-2 junior middle hitter Rylee Kee highlighted an attack that featured kill after kill.

Dyer County is now 9-0 in district play and 27-7 overall. Crockett is 21-9 overall and 8-2 in the district, good for second place.

Kee absolutely dominated play in the middle when she was on the floor, taking full advantage of her height. Reed – who is listed at 5-5 but could probably jump over Kee if she tried – powered Dyer County's outside hitting attack. The Lady Cavs were playing without starting libero Piper White, who suffered a recent severe ankle sprain.

Crockett will face Covington next.

REGION GOLF TOURNAMENT: Crockett had one competitor in the boys' field and one in the girls' Monday at the Humboldt Golf & Country Club, and although both played well, neither advanced to the state tournament level.

On the girls' side, Lady Cav Rachel Crossnoe shot an 89 - improving her score from the previous year by 16 strokes - to finish ninth in a field of 27 players. However, only the winning team and the individuals with the next three best scores (not on the winning team) move forward.

In the boys' competition, Crockett sophomore Jack Shaver shot a solid 77 for the 18 holes, but would have needed a 74 to move onto the state. Shaver placed 11th out of 40 participants.
