At CUSD, we ensure our students are challenged academically to prepare them for higher education and beyond:

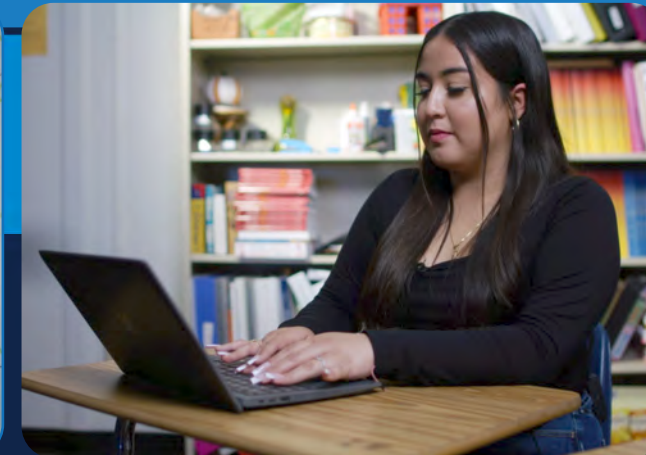

Compton Early College and Dominguez High School named to the 2023 AP Honor Roll.

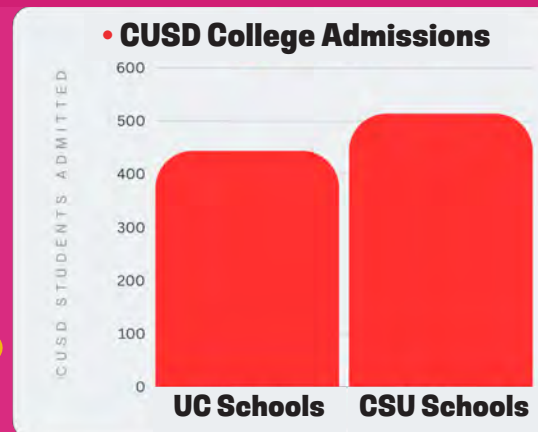
Centennial and Dominguez High Schools won the Exemplary Dual Enrollment Award.

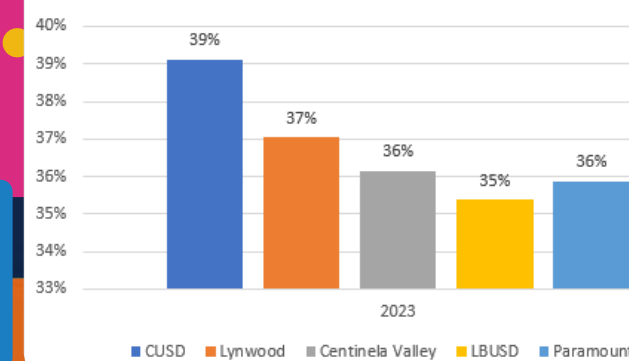

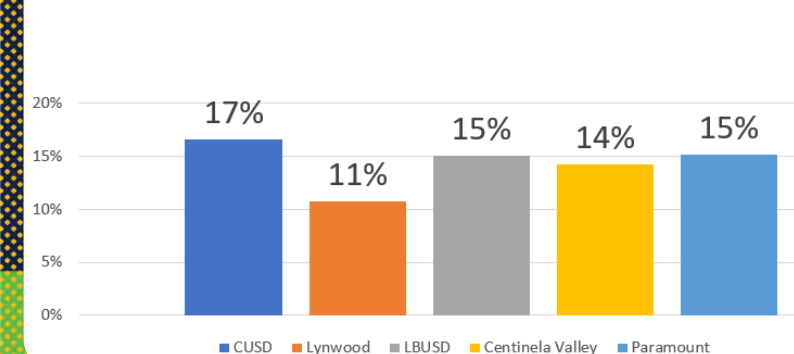

In 2024, Compton Unified recognized 311 scholars who attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation with the Seal of Biliteracy.

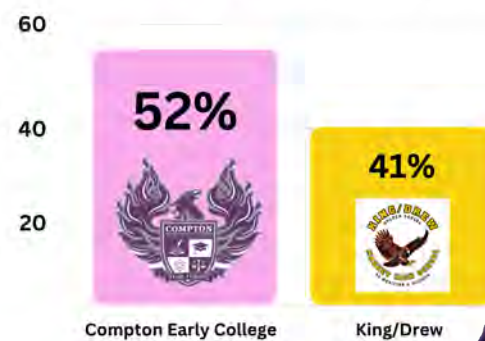
Black Student Achievement (BSA) Elevates Scholars

- * The BSA Department led 21 college field trips exposing over 350 high school students to a range of colleges.
- * Took over 100 high school students to Junior Achievement Finance to acquire financial literacy training and assist them in developing financial literacy.
- * Each year, takes high school students to the Microsoft BAM conference and to Space X to learn about STEM careers and the steps needed to pursue STEM careers.
- * Each year, leads the Compton Goes To College attended by over 150 African American high school students.
- * For two consecutive years the BSA Department has led HBCU tours, resulting in 7 students attending HBCUs.
