Week two is spent volunteering in the rural communities along the Southwest Louisiana coast, restoring wetlands. We visit a variety of historical and cultural museums, the French Quarter, and kayak down the Mississippi River all while eating delicious authentic southern food.

Reflect daily on the trip and service experience.

Galvanize as a group through a combination of large and small group projects and shared responsibilities for cooking, cleaning, and shopping.

Participate in cultural opportunities directly tied to the service-learning mission.

Steward the ongoing relationships with partners and community members.

Respect diversity and cultural norms within the group and the communities where students live and work.
