



School Tuition Fees 2024-25 Academic Year From January 1, 2025

Tuition and Boarding Fees for the 2024-25 Academic Year are inclusive of VAT, which will be applied from January 1, 2025. The Government has confirmed that, as of January 1, 2025, all education services supplied by independent schools will be subject to VAT.

Boarding Fees include:

- Tuition
- Room and full board (breakfast, lunch, dinner, and a variety of snacks in the boarding houses)
- Loan of textbooks
- Most IT and laboratory fees
- Annual laptop maintenance
- Some classroom materials
- Most curriculum-related activities and field trips
- Travel insurance for school-sponsored trips
- Weekly linen service for bed linen and towels and access to laundry facilities with free washing machines and tumble dryers
- Access to the on-campus Health Center with nurses available/on-call 24/7 and weekly visits from a doctor

For Grades 9-12, the costs of the October Travel Week are included in the boarding fees, however parents must register their child for the trip to participate.

For Grade 8, the Start-of-School Bonding Trip is mandatory and costs are included in the boarding fees.

Boarding Fees do not include:

- Private medical insurance (required)
- Uniforms
- Varsity sports travel and equipment
- School-sponsored overnight trips (except October Travel Week or Middle School Bonding Trip)
- Costs of external exams such as the SAT, AP, or IB exams
- Charges related to vaccinations
- Child Student or Student Visa expenses

PAYMENT SCHEDULE AND FURTHER INFORMATION

APPLICATION FEE

The non-refundable application fee of £240 as shown in the Schedule of Fees must accompany each application form. We are unable to issue an invoice for the application fee, but a receipt will be issued upon request.

ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT

A non-refundable enrollment deposit as shown in the Schedule of Fees is payable on enrollment.

For day and boarding students, the deposit will be held in credit by the School, rolled over for subsequent years, and refunded at the end of the final year, less any additional expenses accrued by the student, or donated to the School's Financial Aid Fund.

If a student fails to start or is withdrawn from school, the deposit will be retained by the School.

DEVELOPMENT FUND

All new students pay a one-time-only Development Fund fee of £900 towards the School's ongoing building and maintenance program.

PAYMENT OF FEES

For day students: The first tuition fee installment (60% of the full year fee) and the one-time-only Development Fund fee for new students (£900 inclusive of VAT) are due on June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1. The remaining fees are payable by November 15.

For boarding students who do not require a Child Student Visa or Student Visa: The first tuition fee installment (70% of the full year fee) and the one-time-only Development Fund fee for new students (£900 inclusive of VAT) are due by June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1. The remaining fees are payable by November 15.

Fees for students joining TASIS for the First or Second Semester only are payable in full at enrollment.

MID-YEAR STARTERS

Tuition fees are charged on a pro-rata basis from the student's expected start date, and are payable 14 days from the date of invoice. Supplementary fees will be payable in the event of a student beginning school prior to the expected start date.

CHILD STUDENT VISA OR STUDENT VISA

Should your child require a Child Student Visa or a Student Visa, the School must receive the full tuition amount prior to starting the visa process. The tuition fee is to be received by June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1.

FEE PAYMENT METHODS

Fee payment via our Secure Payment Portal is encouraged and the details are sent out at the time of invoicing. Payments using this method can be made by bank transfer, debit card, or Visa or Mastercard credit card. If you are unable to use the Secure Payment Portal, please contact our Business Office for full details of alternative payment methods.

Please note that any bank charges incurred by payment of school fees will be debited to the student account, and further payment will be required to clear this account.

There is no reduction or refund of fees except in accordance with our Admissions Policy, available on our website. For your reference, extracts of our Cancellation Rules and the Withdrawal Policy and Procedure are set out below. This applies to late enrollment (i.e., due to visa delays), absence, withdrawal, suspension, or permanent exclusion.

LATE PAYMENT FEES

If payment is not received by the School by the due date for payment, we may charge interest on the overdue amount at the rate of 1 percent a year above the base rate. This interest will accrue on a daily basis from the due date until the date of actual payment of the overdue amount. Families are encouraged to speak to the TASIS England Business Office to discuss any potential late payments to arrange for an adjusted payment plan. Students will not be allowed to attend classes, participate in co-curricular activities, or travel with the School until a payment plan has been approved or late fees have been paid.

FEE REVIEWS

Tuition fees are reviewed each year by the TASIS England Board of Directors and generally announced no later than mid-to-late February.

CANCELLATION RULES

Enrollment may be canceled prior to the start of school with no further contractual obligation to one another beyond the following:

1. If the contract is canceled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form prior to June 1, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TASIS England but all additional tuition fees and payments will be refunded.
2. If the contract is canceled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form on or after June 1, but before August 1, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TASIS England and the family will be obligated for 10 percent of the tuition set out in the tuition fee schedule.
3. If the contract is canceled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form on or after August 1, all payments and deposits made to the School will be retained by TASIS England. In addition, the family shall be obligated for the full year's tuition as referenced in the tuition fee schedule and any other fees or expenses that may be due and owing at the time of cancellation.
4. If a student's initial enrollment happens during the academic year (e.g., starting later in the semester or for a January start), or the enrollment process is completed during the summer (after June 1 and prior to the start of school):

- a. If the contract is canceled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form 60 days prior to the start date, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TASIS England but all additional tuition fees and payments will be refunded.
- b. If the contract is canceled less than 60 days from the start date, all payments and deposits made to the School will be retained by TASIS England. In addition, the family shall be obligated for the full pro-rated tuition, based on start date, as referenced in the tuition fee schedule and any other fees or expenses that may be due and owing at the time of cancellation.

ADMISSIONS POLICY – WITHDRAWAL POLICY AND PROCEDURE (EXTRACT):

The expectation is that a student is enrolled for the entirety of the contract. Once enrollment or re-enrollment has been confirmed and a boarding student has arrived on campus or a day student has started classes, no refund or reimbursement of fees is payable in the event of subsequent withdrawal. However, a refund of a student's second semester fees will be available to day student families who are subject to physical relocation if:

- A completed Withdrawal Form is received by the TASIS England Admissions Office no less than 60 days prior to the end of the first semester; and
- TASIS England has accepted a replacement student in the same grade and program to take the place of the withdrawing student, and that the replacement student begins classes at the start of the second semester.

No refund is available for students who have voluntarily withdrawn due to the enactment of a disciplinary process. Full details of our withdrawal policy and procedure can be found in the Admissions Policy on our website.

No reduction of fees will be granted in respect of a student's absence from school.

No records, recommendations, or reports will be released until all financial obligations have been met.

PRIVATE MEDICAL INSURANCE

Private medical insurance is mandatory for boarding students and is available through the School. Upon receipt of a completed medical insurance online application form, TASIS will issue an invoice for the insurance cover. If a boarding student is covered by a personal medical insurance policy, we require a copy of the policy for the School's records.

FORCE MAJEURE

The School reserves the right at its sole discretion to suspend the obligations in the contract for the period of time that a condition of Force Majeure exists. "Force Majeure" means an act of God, strike, lock-out, act of public enemy, war, blockade, pandemic, civil disturbance, or other causes beyond the reasonable control of the School such as to make in-person and Remote Learning impossible or impracticable, as determined solely by the School. The School shall immediately notify parents/guardians of any suspension due to a Force Majeure event. The School and parents/guardians agree to use their best efforts to eliminate the effects of the Force Majeure event and to resume performance of the contract as soon as possible after the Force Majeure event ceases. The School is not liable for any costs incurred by parents/guardians due to delays or non-performance of obligations as a result of the Force Majeure event.

CONSUMER RIGHTS

The School will exercise reasonable care and skill in providing educational services for the student but cannot guarantee that s/he will achieve his/her desired examination results or that results will be sufficient to gain entry to other educational establishments.

We provide parents of prospective students with information about the School and the educational services we provide in good faith. This information may be contained in the promotional literature or in statements made by staff or students during a visit or an open day.

TASIS England's policies are available in full on our website. If parents wish to take account of the information provided to them when deciding whether to enter into a contract with the School, they should seek specific confirmation from the School that the information is accurate beforehand.

THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

Only the School and the parents are parties to the contract. Neither the student nor any third party is a party to this contract and shall not have any rights to enforce any term of it.

VARIATIONS

These terms and conditions and the schedule of fees are subject to change from time to time to reflect changes in the law or in custom and practice at the School.

JURISDICTION

Contracts of enrollment are made at the School and they, together with each matter relating to the provision of educational services by the School, are governed exclusively by the law of England and Wales and the parties submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales.
