Offer Verses Serve (OVS)

Offer Versus Serve (OVS) is a meal service method designed to reduce food waste and food costs in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program without jeopardizing the nutritional integrity of the meals served.

At lunch, schools must offer all five components (fruit, vegetables, grains, meat/meat alternates, fluid milk) and students must select at least three components, one of which is 1/2 cup fruit and/or vegetable.

At breakfast, schools must offer at least four food items from three required components (fruit, grains, fluid milk) and students must select at least three food items, one of which is 1/2 cup fruit and/or vegetable.

Students must choose the required items to meet meal requirements for proper prices and benefit issuance. Students should always be allowed to take all of the components in the full portion sizes if they choose. Cafeteria Charge Policy

Students with any negative amount are still allowed to charge reimbursable meals to their lunch account. The student will not be allowed to purchase any la carte items.

- A letter is sent home after the student's account is \$10.00 negative. Prompt payment is expected to return the account to a positive balance.
- A second letter is sent home after the student's account is \$50.00 negative. A free and reduced lunch application will accompany notification of the negative balance. Upon return of the application, you will be notified if your child qualifies for free or reduced lunch prices.
- If no attempt is made to satisfy the debt, the debt may be settled in small claims court.

Food Service Department meal charge procedure goals are:

- To treat all students with dignity in the serving line regarding meal accounts;
- To support positive situations with district staff, district business policies, students, and parents to the maximum extent possible;
- To encourage parents to assume the responsibility of meal payments;
- To establish a consistent district procedure regarding charges and collection of charges
