

Executive Board Governance and Operations

Vacancies and Unexpired Term Fulfillment

Whenever a vacancy occurs on the Executive Board, the Governing Board President shall appoint an acting successor to serve on the Executive Board until the next Governing Board meeting can confirm a permanent replacement to complete the term of office.

The Office of a Board member becomes vacant before the term's expiration when any of the following occurs:

1. Death of the incumbent;
2. Resignation in writing filed with the Secretary of the Board;
3. Legal disability;
4. Conviction of a felony, bribery, perjury, or other infamous crime or of any offense involving a violation of official oath or of a violent crime against a child;
5. Removal from office;
6. The decision of a competent tribunal declaring his or her election void;
7. Ceasing to be an inhabitant of the District or a particular area from which he or she was elected, if the residential requirements contained in The School Code are violated;
8. An illegal conflict of interest;
9. Acceptance of a second public office that is incompatible with Executive Board membership;
10. Resignation as Superintendent from the Superintendent's current District; or
11. Resignation as Governing Board member from the member's district.

Immediately following a vacancy on the Board, the Board will publicize it and accept résumés from Governing Board Members or Member District Superintendents who are interested in filling the vacancy. After reviewing the applications, the Board may invite the prospective candidates for personal interviews to be conducted during duly scheduled closed meetings. The Governing Board must confirm a replacement.
